# Glenwood High School

Project update | June 2023

The NSW Government is continuing its program to deliver new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This includes the Glenwood High School project.

## Project overview

A project is underway to upgrade Glenwood High School with new and improved education facilities to support the student community. The project will deliver:

- a new 3-storey building with 47 flexible learning spaces
- a new performing arts centre
- an upgrade of the building A ground floor
- upgrades to buildings E and J.

## Progress update

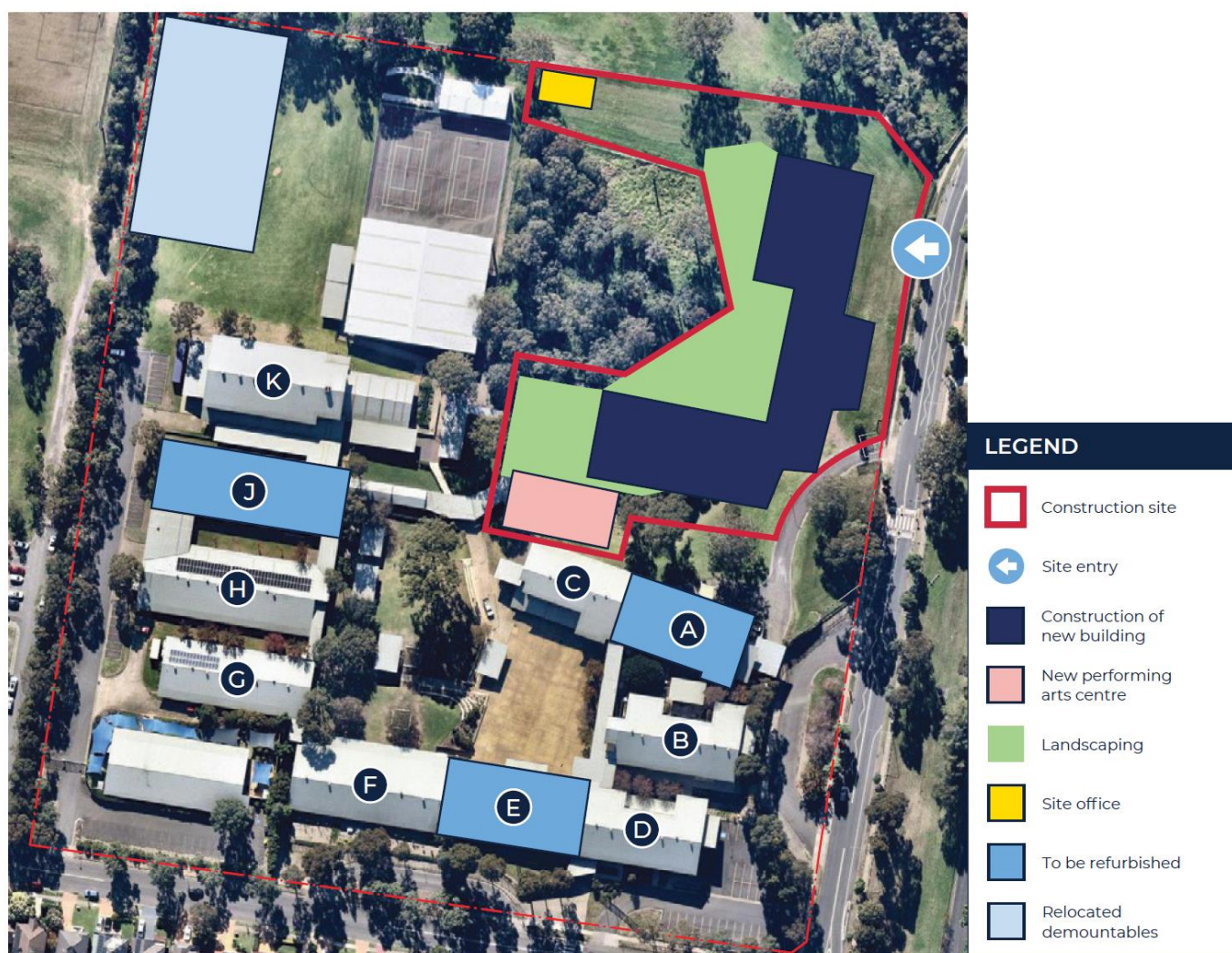
Main works are progressing at Glenwood High School.

- The structure for the new 3-storey building is nearing completion.
- The installation of in-ground services including storm water pipe works, sewer pipe works and electrical cabling across the site are 90% complete.
- Exterior and interior wall and roof framing works for the new performing arts centre have started.

## Next steps

- Steel framing will be erected for the new performing arts centre.
- Refurbishment works across Building A and Building D.
- Internal works for the new 3-storey building.
