Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild essential services, the 2023-24 Budget is delivering a record \$3.5 billion for new and upgraded schools in Western Sydney. This targeted investment in growing communities will ensure working families get access to a world class public education.

Project overview

An upgrade to Glenwood High School is underway, with new and improved education facilities to support the student community. The project is being delivered in 3 stages.

Stage 1 opened on Day 1 Term 4 2023 and we are excited to welcome students and staff to the following new facilities (see photos overleaf):

- A new single storey Performing Arts Centre.
- Ground floor of the new 3 storey building that features 3 specialist science labs and 4 modern classrooms.

Stages 2 and 3 will open Day 1 Term 1 2024 and will provide:

- A new 3 storey building (Building N) with remaining 41 technology rich classrooms and workshops.
- Upgrades to Buildings D, E and J.

Next steps

- The school to relocate into the new Performing Arts Centre and science labs.
- Interior works to progressively continue within the new building N.
- Refurbishment works to Blocks E and J to commence.
- Minor works to the eastern carpark.

The ground floor of Building N was handed over during the school holidays. This section includes 3 specialist science labs and 4 modern classrooms. The school is transitioning to teach in the new classrooms in Term 4. Works are progressing on the remainder of Building N, to be ready for opening on Day 1 Term 1 2024.

Performing Arts Centre

The Performing Arts Centre, located next to Building C, is open and ready for Glenwood High School students from Day 1 Term 4 2023. This new building will establish a creative learning hub by providing contemporary spaces for performing arts, workshops and rehearsals. It is the first of 2 new buildings for the school. A multipurpose facility for health, physical education, dance, drama and music, the Performing Arts Centre may be used after school hours for rehearsal and can be shared with the community.

The new centre was designed to integrate into the existing tree scape and retain the character of the local area. The location of the building will provide a better spatial relationship between the new and existing buildings and outdoor courtyard. The building is accessible to all students, with ramps throughout for easy access.
