Flood Recovery Update

Supporting flood-impacted schools

A large number of schools in the Northern Rivers region experienced flood damage either to the entire site or some buildings and facilities.

Some parts of the Coraki Public School site, including the community space in Block D, the General Assistant's shed and the school soccer field were impacted by flood water. A second flood in March disrupted work and impacted the school soccer field again.

Current status

Work to repair school infrastructure damaged by the flood water is now complete.

- Students are learning from their classrooms.
- The playground and playing fields have been remediated for students to use for sport and play.
- Work has been completed on the community space in Block D, which was operating in another part of the school.

Next steps

- Top dressing of the playground will be undertaken during the next school holidays.
- School Infrastructure NSW will continue to monitor the school for any ongoing issues that can be associated with water inundation and undertake any treatment or remediation that is needed.

What else is happening in the region?

Most students are back at their usual schools, while some students have been relocated to alternative sites so that their learning can continue while school repairs or rebuilding is underway. Nine schools in the region are being rebuilt after suffering extensive damage as a result of the floods. Significant work is being undertaken to repair and remediate a further seven schools that experienced a large amount of damage in the floods.
