Our Delivery Strategy

This month, we celebrate 5 years as School Infrastructure NSW. Since 2017, we have worked exceptionally hard to establish ourselves as an infrastructure agency that delivers the very best learning environments that meet the needs of a growing student population.

Every day, our teams support more than 800,000 public school students and more than 120,000 employees of the department who are located across more than 2,200 schools. We have a long history of keeping schools safe through maintenance and materials management, with a more recent focus on accelerating a range of projects in metro and regional areas to ensure the safety, reliability and longevity of our school facilities.

Our teams are responsible for the delivery of the largest investment in educational infrastructure in the history of NSW, with the NSW Government investing \$8.6 billion over the next four years. This builds on the \$9.1 billion in projects delivered since 2017, a program of \$17.7 billion in public education infrastructure.

In the recently announced 2022-23 NSW Budget, the NSW Government added 23 major capital works projects and additional minor works funding to the historic school building program. Families across New South Wales will benefit from this \$1.6 billion investment in education infrastructure.

Nine of these major projects are part of the commitment to WestInvest; a \$5 billion infrastructure program transforming Western Sydney. WestInvest will improve the liveability of communities and support economic recovery, making a real difference to the quality of life in the 15 local government areas that were hardest hit by COVID restrictions in 2021.

Advanced manufacturing capability and digitalisation is a strategic objective for the NSW Government. We want to explore ideas that will upskill the workforce, create new market sectors where this industry can grow, and lead to improved outcomes for the students of NSW. We are looking to integrate the latest digital technology, modern methods of construction, 'kit of parts' methodologies and mass production. Our goal is to deliver high-quality flexible teaching spaces that meet sustainability objectives and deliver value for money.

In this Delivery Strategy, we are expanding our use of our kit of parts to design and deliver core learning spaces on a number of upcoming schools. See page 8 for more details on how you can join us on this journey.

The NSW Government is committed to supporting the infrastructure industry through the Infrastructure Traineeship program, with 175 Year 12 school leavers currently on board. The two-year office-based traineeship is a collaboration between NSW Government infrastructure agencies and industry partners, offering Year 12 school leavers a rounded experience through three 8-month rotations with government agencies, contractors and consultant organisations. We value your commitment to building career pathways into infrastructure as part of this program and look forward to your continued support as the 2023 intake opens for more than 140 students across the state.

Schools are at the heart of communities. They bring communities together and provide comfort and normality for students impacted by the pandemic, natural disasters and other unprecedented events that have hit NSW in the past few years. Working together, we are all making a positive difference to young people and their local communities right across NSW.

Engaging with suppliers

Our aim is to:

- issue competitive tenders that will suit a broad range of suppliers
- stagger the release of tenders, providing suppliers with an opportunity for a debrief before the next round of tenders is issued
- offer whole-of-life project engagements, creating an opportunity for suppliers to invest in their teams
- limit the number of tenders issued to no more than 10 per discipline per month, to avoid overwhelming the market.

We have grouped some projects into clusters to:

- drive efficiencies for both our suppliers and the NSW Government
- streamline the tendering process, with the aim of reducing costs for suppliers by appointing a single supplier for each of the disciplines.

We will engage specialists' services, such as the ones listed below, on a project-by-project basis:

- business case development
- transport planning
- acoustic engineering
- surveying
- ecology

- community and stakeholder engagement
- social impact assessments
- waste management
- geotechnical and/or contamination
- arboriculture

- environmentally sustainable design
- Aboriginal and European heritage
- Building Code of Australia (BCA)
- disability, accessibility and inclusion
- flood modelling

Our approach will be to:

- liaise with suppliers before finalising the tender list, to ensure those invited have the appetite and capacity to submit a competitive tender, and be part of the team to deliver the required project/desired outcomes, should they be successful
- use refined and standardised scopes of service for each engagement, with any non-standard or project-specific requirements clearly identified in the tender documents
- monitor performance via our performance management process and reward top performers with the opportunity to tender for future opportunities
- invite a maximum of 4 tenderers per opportunity, so evaluations are quicker and more effective for suppliers
- identify opportunities to appoint suppliers that are:
 - o Aboriginal-owned businesses
 - o able to demonstrate a diverse workforce
 - o small-or medium-sized businesses
 - o locally owned, or will commit to using local labour and businesses.





Modern methods of construction to create new classrooms for NSW

School Infrastructure NSW is leading through innovation to deliver a new age of school building, driving positive change that will create a sustainable market in modern methods of construction (MMC). The educational infrastructure we are building reflects our ambition to enable the rapid delivery of high quality, efficient and sustainable educational infrastructure to create flexible, contemporary learning environments that support teachers and students to achieve outstanding learning outcomes.

In early 2022, we engaged a range of industry partners as part of an EOI process, to explore technology integration and innovative approaches to delivering new teaching spaces, seeking to maximise our efficiency across a program of work. The EOI phase is now complete and we will continue the procurement process through the next stages. This was one of many opportunities to partner with us for the exploration, innovation and application of modern methods of construction to deliver the future of public schools.

The new approach to delivering infrastructure relies on getting the most out of all the parties involved through collaboration and integration to produce better outcomes for all.

To progress our MMC model, we will deliver a number of projects announced in the 2022-23 NSW Budget at a program level. The pavilion integrator model aims to provide our suppliers with certainty on construction methodology.

In this model, nominated projects will be delivered at a program level, in partnership with our successful MMC integrator and our network of assemblers. A percentage of components will be manufactured offsite, in line with School Infrastructure NSW's designs and assembled onsite.

Under this new way of working, we will see significant coordination between project and program teams. Information will be clearly outlined in the tender documents for these projects. For projects that are not nominated, contractors have the choice to deliver school projects using whichever construction methodology (kit of parts/volumetric modules/traditional construction/hybrid model) that best suits the project's needs while representing value for money.

Integrated school developments

Placing schools at the heart of new communities

NSW is experiencing unprecedented population growth and demand for school spaces, particularly in urban areas. To help meet the challenge of changing demographics, School Infrastructure NSW is considering innovative options to deliver new schools in specific situations where accessing land is difficult.

For example, partnering with other government agencies and the private sector to plan and deliver schools to our standard designs and specifications as part of an integrated development will help reduce land costs and allow schools to be a shared community feature of newly established precincts.

This approach aims to encourage innovation in design and construction and increase opportunities to share publicly owned school facilities with the wider community.

Student-centred and personalised learning will continue to be our focus when planning and delivering NSW public schools. We will also continue to look for ways to use taxpayer funds more efficiently and effectively.
