

Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over four years to deliver more than 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across New South Wales. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Ajuga, Campbell House and Glenfield House Schools

A project to upgrade Ajuga, Campbell House and Glenfield Park Schools for Specific Purposes is underway. The upgrade will deliver:

- 15 new permanent learning spaces five for each school
- Six new life skills spaces two for each school
- Practical activity spaces for each of the three schools
- A new multi-purpose hall and associated fitness centre to be shared by all three schools.

Progress summary

Work is progressing well with the installation of roofs for the new learning spaces at Ajuga and Glenfield Park.

Other progress includes the installation of the concrete slab for the new multi-purpose hall and continuing work on the new swimming pool amenities at Glenfield Park.

Term 1 holiday works

Works will start for the relocation of the existing outdoor shade sail at Glenfield Park. Other works include starting to install the building structure at Campbell House.

Construction work will take place Monday to Friday, 7:00am to 5:00pm, and Saturday 8:00am to 1:00pm. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays.

Frequently asked questions

What works will be completed over the holidays?

Construction activities will continue during the Term 1 holidays. Work will start on the relocation of the existing outdoor shade sail at Glenfield Park.

Work will also start on the installation of the building structure at Campbell House.

What are the construction working hours?

Construction hours over the Term 1 holidays will be as per the standard hours:

- Monday to Friday, 7:00am to 5:00pm
- Saturday, 8:00am to 1:00pm

No work will be undertaken on public holidays or Sunday.

Will construction take place over the Easter public holidays?

No construction will take place over the Easter public holidays from Friday 10 April to Monday 13 April, inclusive.

What safety measures will be in place?

The health and safety of the community is our highest priority. Temporary fencing has been erected around the construction site to secure the area and prevent public access.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Noise and dust control measures will be implemented in accordance with planning approval requirements.

Temporary fencing and shade cloth has been erected to reduce dust impacts on the schools. The site will be regularly hosed down as required, to minimise dust, pending water restrictions.

How will traffic be managed?

Traffic management will be in place where required for the safety of the local community and workers. Monitoring of the entry gates will continue. Vehicles will give way to pedestrians at all times.
