New facilities

Arthur Phillip High School has innovative learning spaces with adaptable / moveable furniture and room configurations, specialist STEAM teaching facilities, a large amphitheatre, two new outdoor sports courts and a double-size multi-sport gymnasium with associated landscaped areas.

Parramatta Public School has 40 permanent, flexible learning spaces and support areas, modern indoor and outdoor landscaped areas including a rooftop learning area.

Both schools offer technology-rich teaching spaces and innovative learning opportunities for students in the heart of Parramatta CBD.

Frequently asked questions

When will the rest of the schools be delivered and the projects finalised?

The final stage of works will remove non-heritage buildings located at the former Arthur Phillip High School site, which will be converted into shared outdoor play areas for both schools. The final stage of works is expected to be completed in late 2020.

What construction works will take place in 2020?

Early works will start soon. The contractor will commence enabling works which includes ongoing investigative works, removal of redundant furniture and preparations for scaffolding and hoarding installation around the former APHS site.

What are the construction working hours for remaining works?

Works will continue in accordance with the State Significant Development Approval conditions. The hours of construction are 7:00am – 6:00pm weekdays and 7:30am – 3:30pm on Saturdays. No works will take place on Sundays or Public Holidays, unless separately approved.

How will you keep us informed?

School Infrastructure NSW is committed to keeping the school community informed about the next stage of works and will hold an information booth during Term 1, 2020 prior to demolition works commencing. Details for the information booth will be shared soon.

The community will also be informed about the project via website updates, works notifications and through face to face information sessions.
