Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over the next four years to deliver 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Arthur Phillip High School Project

A project is underway to redevelop the existing Arthur Phillip High School site into the first public high-rise high school in NSW.

The project will:

- Accommodate up to 2,000 students
- Incorporate flexible learning spaces with adaptable / moveable furniture and room configurations
- Include technology-rich learning spaces, with an emphasis on mobility and flexibility, and
- Deliver innovative, connected outdoor spaces that enable play and collaborative learning.

Project update

Arthur Phillip High School is currently in its final construction phase, with structure completed as internal and external works are ongoing. The department will ensure care will be taken to minimise noise and disruption to the surrounding community. Traffic control and security measures will be in place where required for the safety of students, staff and the community. Construction will continue to take place Monday to Friday, 7am to 5pm and Saturdays, 7am to 3pm. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays.

Arthur Phillip High school remains on schedule for completion and will be operational for Day 1, Term 1, 2020.

The department will continue to update the community on this exciting project through project updates, information drop-in sessions and the website. We will hold information sessions at the existing school early in Term 4, 2019.

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
