Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over the next four years to deliver 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW.

In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Arthur Phillip High School

A project to redevelop Arthur Phillip High School into the first public high-rise high school in NSW is almost complete.

The new high school will be ready for the start of school in 2020 and will:

- Accommodate up to 2,000 students
- Incorporate flexible learning spaces with adaptable, moveable furniture and room configurations
- Include technology-enabled learning spaces, with an emphasis on mobility and flexibility
- Deliver innovative, connected outdoor spaces that enable play and collaborative learning.

Progress summary

The Arthur Phillip High School redevelopment is progressing well with all structural works and external glazing complete.

Works on internal areas of the tower building and gymnasium are nearly complete.

Outdoor learning spaces and hard and soft external landscaping are underway.

Summer school holiday works

Over the summer school break, work will continue across the site to complete the school redevelopment. This will involve improvement works to the footpath and traffic signage along Macquarie Street and Barrack Lane, relocation of temporary site accommodation, and relocation of school resources from the existing school to the new school.

Traffic control and security measures will be in place where required for the safety of the community.

Frequently asked questions

What works will be completed over the holidays?

Works are almost complete for the new Arthur Phillip High School. During December and January, works include, but will not be limited to:

- Public domain improvement works (e.g. new footpaths and traffic signage)
- Finishing touches to internal learning spaces
- Relocation of temporary site accommodation
- Relocation of school resources from the existing school to the new school.

What are the construction working hours?

Construction work will continue in line with the times approved in the Development Application of Monday to Friday, 7:00am to 11:00pm and Saturdays, 7:00am to 3:00pm. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays.

Will construction take place over Christmas and New Year?

The contractor will continue works as required throughout the Christmas and New Year period, in line with the approved Development Application. No work will take place on public holidays.

What safety measures will be in place?

A Construction Management Plan is in place as part of the Development Application consent requirements. Safety measures include but are not limited to:

- Site fencing
- Locks and surveillance systems
- Security lighting and motion detectors.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Measures are in place to minimise noise and dust impacts including:

- Selecting and using machinery to limit noise and vibration
- Using a site layout that avoids truck reversing, idling and requires fewer vehicle movements
- Complying with best practice environmental standards to reduce dust.

How will traffic be managed?

Traffic controllers will be used on site to assist with traffic movement where necessary. Vehicles entering, exiting and driving around the site will give way to pedestrians at all times.
