

Public Preschools in Fairfield

Project update | November 2024



As part of NSW Government's plan to rebuild public education, the 2024-25 Budget is continuing a \$769 million investment to deliver 100 new public preschools, including new preschools on future primary school sites.

Supporting early childhood education in Fairfield

The new public preschools in Fairfield will be located at William Stimson Public School, Prairievale Public School, Fairfield West Public School, Governor Philip King Public School, Edensor Park Public School, Villawood North Public School, Cabramatta West Public School, Carramar Public School, Lansvale East Public School and Mount Pritchard Public School.

The preschools will be co-located on existing public primary school sites.

The locations of the public preschools have been selected based on careful evaluation and selection criteria with considerations to educational need and demand, how children grow and learn, infrastructure feasibility, and insights gained through consultation.

The new preschools are scheduled to be open by 2027. Each school will communicate with their community when enrolment applications can be taken, which is expected to be approximately 6 months before the preschool opening date.

Progress update

We are pleased to confirm that as designs are being finalised the tender has been released for construction contractors for William Stimson Public Preschool, Prairievale Public Preschool, Fairfield West Public Preschool, Governor Philip King Public Preschool, Edensor Park Public Preschool, Villawood North Public Preschool, Cabramatta West Public Preschool, Carramar Public Preschool, Lansvale East Public Preschool and Mount Pritchard Public Preschool.

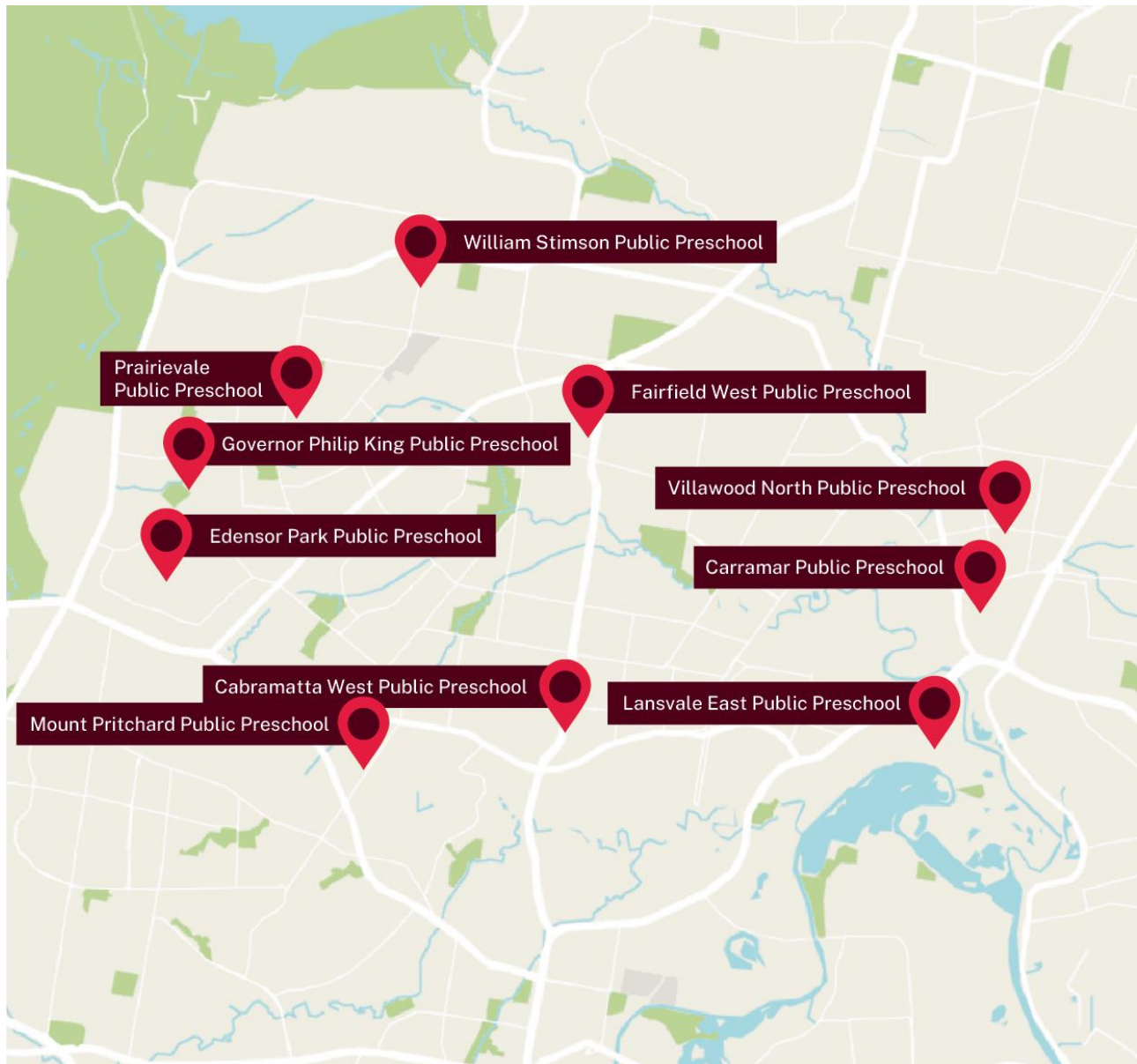
To complete master plans more efficiently, we have adopted a standardised design approach which has been developed in consultation with educational experts as well as design and engineering specialists. This approach also complies with the National Quality Framework (NQF).



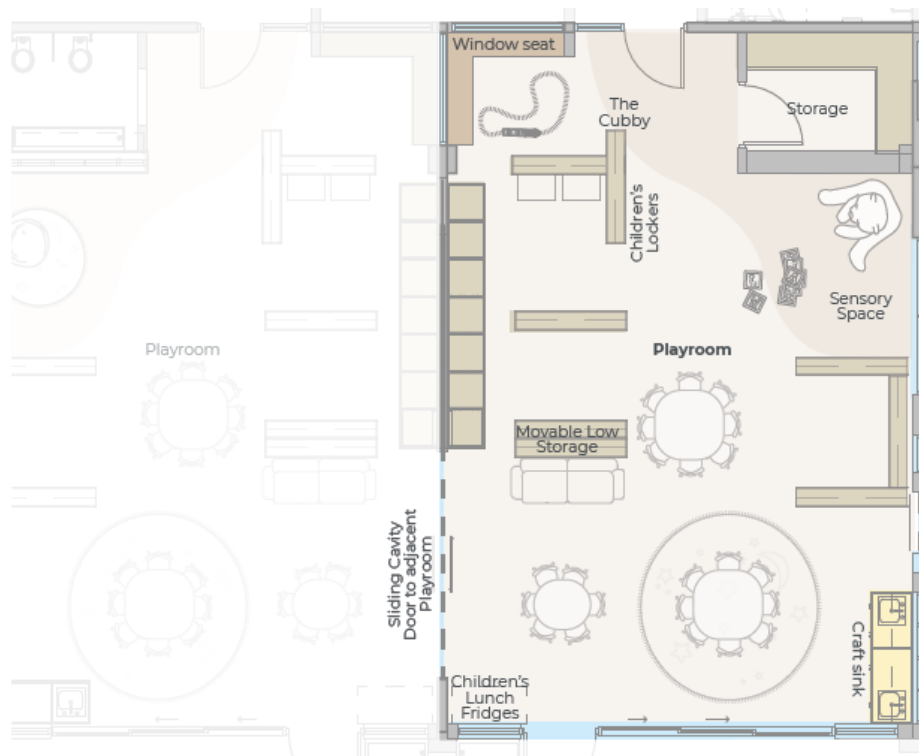
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The key design principles for our new public preschools are that they should be welcoming and safe, connected with community and the environment, and inclusive, quality play-based learning environments.

Each preschool has established a Project Reference Group (PRG) made up of school and department leadership representatives, and a school community representative.
