The NSW Government is investing \$8.6 billion in school infrastructure over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 160 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This builds on the more than \$9.1 billion invested in projects delivered since 2017, a program of \$17.7 billion in public education infrastructure.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

A new high school in Bungendore is being delivered to accommodate 450 students. The project will also upgrade facilities at Bungendore Public School.

Project overview

The new high school will have modern facilities with 24 flexible learning spaces including 3 support learning spaces, a library, hall, school canteen, playing courts, an agricultural plot, and kiss and drop zones.

Learning spaces will be built to enable teaching of English, Mathematics, Science, Technologies, Human Society and its Environment (HSIE), Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE), Creative Arts, Languages, Vocational Education and Training (VET), and Agriculture.

Project progress

The Department of Education lodged the State Significant Development (SSD) application with the Department of Planning and Environment in 2021. The application was on exhibition and more than 300 submissions were received.

The Department of Education has now lodged its Response to Submissions (RtS) report as part of the SSD application. This includes an Amendment Report, which outlines key changes to the design that have been made to address important feedback from community and stakeholders.

Design evolution

School Infrastructure NSW has been working with Queanbeyan-Palerang Regional Council (QPRC) and local stakeholders to address items raised in the submissions, which will include making certain modifications to the design of the school. Those design modifications include:

- Changes to the school buildings:
 - amendment to the layout and design
 - relocation of buildings and sporting facilities
 - reducing bulk and scale of the school buildings
 - amending the colours and finishes
 - removal of the community facilities which are being provided by Council (now a separate planning process on a separate site).
- The original alignment of Majara Street has been reinstated within the revised design.
- Amending the landscaping scheme with additional planting, relocation of covered walkways, removal of bollards and the post-rail delineation around Mick Sherd Oval and the War Memorial, and a through-site connection between the school avenue and Mick Sherd Oval.
- Amendments to the waste collection arrangements and relocation of the waste storage area.
- Provision of an additional 58 car parking spaces along Turallo Terrace providing a total of 98 spaces (compared to the original 40). An additional 3 drop off/pickup spaces are proposed on Turallo Terrace providing a total of 10 kiss and drop spaces (6 on Turallo Terrace and 4 on Gibraltar Street).
- Replacement of the pedestrian crossings with wombat crossings on Turallo Terrace and Gibraltar Street.
- Replacement of the electronic notice board with a static notice board within the boundaries of the school.
