Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7.9 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 215 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

Canterbury South Public School is being redeveloped to provide new flexible learning spaces and upgraded core facilities, to support the growing student enrolments in the area.

Progress summary

We are excited to have delivered stage 1 of the upgrade in time for Day 1 Term 1 2022. Stage 1 provided a new library, canteen, special programs rooms and administration facilities in Block 1, and a new hall and covered outdoor learning area (COLA) in Block 2. Over the summer school holidays, the temporary buildings for administration and canteen facilities were removed from the school site and the old library building was demolished.

Construction on Block 3 (formerly referred to as Block C), the new three-storey building with 30 flexible learning spaces, is progressing well and the building's structure has been completed.

Autumn holiday works

Construction will continue at Canterbury South Public School over the school holidays. Works on Block 3 will include completing the building façade, window frames and glazing. Work will also continue on the internal fit out and lift installation. The contractor will start external works between Blocks 1, 2 and 3 to add paving, tiered seating, soft landscaping and play space.

Public domain works

France Street


Public domain works started on France Street in March 2022 and are expected to continue until mid-May 2022. These works will provide an upgrade of the pedestrian walkway to the Pat O'Conner Reserve, a ramp for the school's new internal link road, pathways from the school's current staff car park to Block 2, a new permanent fence around the school boundary and double gates at the entrance to the new internal link road.

Replacing pedestrian islands and kerb ramps

Works to replace pedestrian islands and kerb ramps on Barnes Avenue west of Woolcott Street are nearing completion. Remaining works include:

- replacing existing pedestrian islands and kerb ramps at Fuller Avenue west of Woolcott Street
- replacing an existing pedestrian island on Howard Street west of High Street
- kerb adjustments to Cooks Avenue west of High Street.

The works will take around 2 to 3 weeks to complete in each area and are expected to continue until mid-May 2022. In the event of wet weather, works may be rescheduled. While the works are being undertaken, traffic controllers will be in place on Barnes Avenue, Fuller Avenue, Howard Street and Cooks Avenue to manage traffic flow and pedestrian safety.

Frequently asked questions

What are the construction hours for this project?

Standard construction hours for this project are 7 am to 5 pm Monday to Saturday. No works will take place on Sunday or public holidays, unless otherwise notified.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Hoarding and shade cloth will be used to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and its neighbours. Dust from demolition and construction works will be hosed down with water as required. Trucks entering and leaving the site will cover their loads and be washed down to prevent tracking dust and mud from the site.
