Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over the next four years to deliver 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Canterbury South Public School

A project is underway to upgrade Canterbury South Public School. The upgrade will deliver:

- 18 new classrooms to increase the school's enrolment capacity to accommodate up to 690 students
- an upgrade of core facilities including a hall, library, canteen and administration buildings.

Progress summary

Early works, as part of a complying development consent, are underway with a tender for construction awarded to TCQ Constructions.

The development application (DA) for the main works is awaiting approval by Canterbury Bankstown Council.

Site establishment and works commencement

Site establishment will commence in December 2019 to prepare the site for construction. This will be followed by main works once the DA is approved.

Construction will take place between 7.00am and 5.00pm Monday to Friday, and 8.00am and 1.00pm on Saturdays. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays unless approval and notification is provided.

During construction, traffic management will be implemented to ensure the safety of students, teachers, staff, site visitors and neighbours. Measures will be in place to mitigate noise and dust levels, including hoarding, hosing down of vehicles as required. Deliveries will be scheduled outside of pick up and drop off times where possible.

School Infrastructure NSW will work closely with the school community and neighbours to minimise impacts where possible.



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Frequently asked questions

When is the project expected to be completed?

The upgrade to is expected to be completed in mid 2021, subject to DA approval and weather permitting.

How will noise during construction be managed?

The construction program has been designed to minimise the impacts of noise for students, staff and residents. Particular focus has been placed on ensuring there is minimal noise during school hours.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Hoarding and shade cloth will be used to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and its neighbours. Dust from demolition and construction works will be hosed down with water as required.

Trucks entering and leaving the site will cover their loads and be washed down to prevent tracking dust and mud from the site.

Will the school entrances change?

No. The entrances to the school will remain the same.

Will staff car parking change?

Staff car parking on the school site may be affected. Any changes that are required during construction will be clearly communicated to the school to allow sufficient time to plan for changes.

Will tree removal be required?

Yes. Some trees have been identified for removal to allow for the new buildings. These trees will be replaced on site as part of the landscaping works.

Will students be relocated during the upgrade?

Students affected by the building program were relocated to demountable classrooms in mid 2019.
