

Canterbury South Public School

Works notification

16 March 2022

A project is underway to upgrade Canterbury South Public School and provide new and improved education facilities to support the student community.

The project includes works to upgrade the public domain as part of the planning approval conditions for the upgrade project. The public domain works will improve pedestrian safety and encourage active travel to and from Canterbury South Public School.

The public domain works will start on Wednesday 23 March 2022 and are expected to continue until mid-May 2022, weather permitting. In the event of wet weather, works may be postponed.

Replacing pedestrian islands and kerb ramps

Works to replace pedestrian islands and kerb ramps were due to take place in February 2022. However, due to contractor availability, they have been rescheduled.

In addition, following discussions with Canterbury Bankstown Council, it has been agreed that works will no longer include Potter Avenue or Canton Street as previously advised in works notifications dated 28 October 2021 and 7 February 2022.

The revised scope of works includes:

- removing and replacing existing pedestrian islands and kerb ramps at Barnes Avenue and Fuller Avenue west of Woolcott Street
- removing and replacing an existing pedestrian island on Howard Street west of High Street
- kerb adjustments to Cooks Avenue west of High Street.

Works on Barnes Avenue and Fuller Avenue are expected to take 2 to 3 weeks and will be completed before starting works on Howard Street and Cooks Avenue.

To comply with current Australian Standards and Transport for NSW (TfNSW) Technical Guidelines, it is necessary to install No Stopping restrictions at the proposed pedestrian refuge islands. This will result in the removal of two on-street parking spaces on the western side of Howard Street as previously notified.

While the works are being undertaken, traffic controllers will be in place on Barnes Avenue, Fuller Avenue, Howard Street and Cooks Avenue to manage traffic flow and pedestrian safety. Access to residential properties and pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the works.

Public domain works on France Street

Public domain works on France Street will start on Wednesday 23 March 2022 and continue until mid-May. The works will include:

- upgrading the pedestrian walkway from France Street to the Pat O’Conner Reserve
- creating a ramp for the school’s new internal link road
- completing pathways from the school’s current staff car park to Block 2
- installing footings and a new permanent fence around the school boundary
- installing double gates at the entrance to the new internal link road.

To ensure the safety of the community, temporary fencing will be installed around the works and extended into the France Street turning circle. Traffic barriers will be placed on France Street to assist students and pedestrians with crossing into the reserve via a temporary footpath. The works will not affect access to residential properties or parking on France Street.

Hoarding and shade cloth will be used to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and its neighbours. Dust from construction works will be hosed down with water as required. Trucks entering and leaving the site will cover their loads and be washed down to prevent tracking dust and mud from the site.

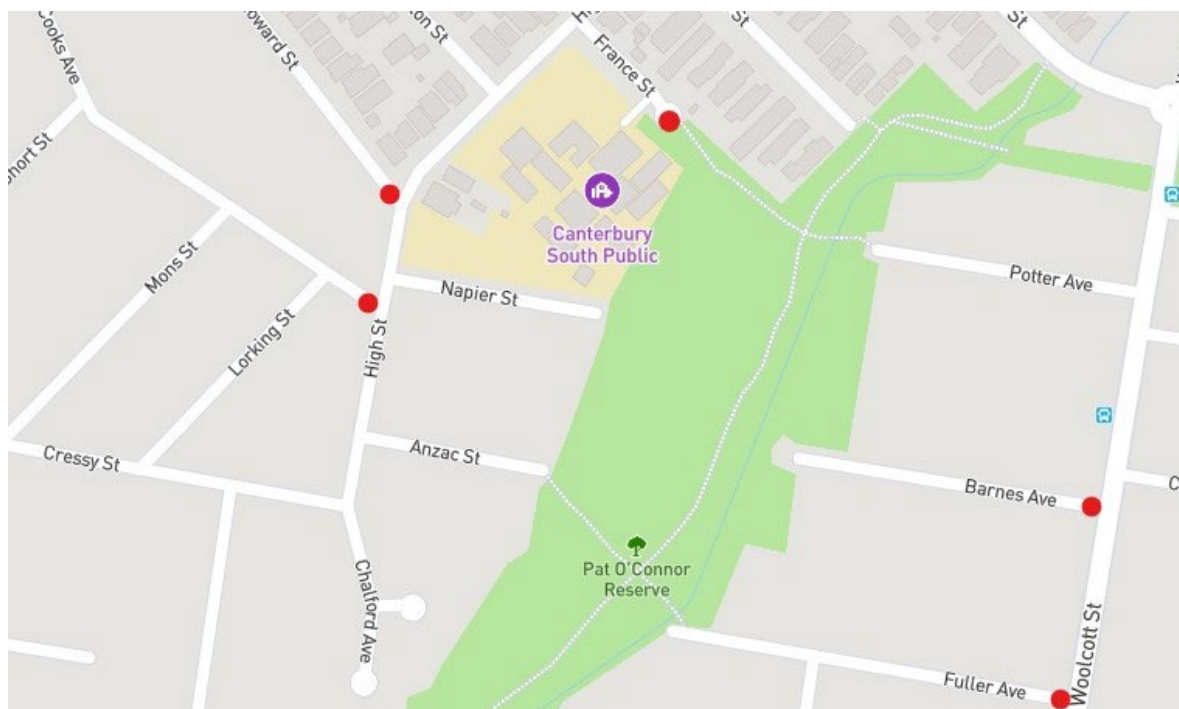
Change in construction hours until Thursday 31 March 2022

The NSW Government has recently passed legislation, Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID-19 Development-Construction Work Days) Order 2022, to allow construction hours to be extended outside of those specified in the development consent conditions to protect the health, safety and welfare of construction workers and our community during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The new construction hours are 7 am to 5 pm Monday to Saturday and 9 am to 5 pm Sunday. Work completed on a Sunday is restricted to certain activities to minimise noise and impact to the community. No work will occur on public holidays.

From Friday 1 April 2022, the project will revert to standard construction hours of 7 am to 5 pm Monday to Saturday and no works will take place on Sunday or public holidays, unless otherwise notified.
