Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild public education, the 2024-25 Budget is delivering record education funding, including \$8.9 billion for new and upgraded schools. This targeted investment will ensure growing communities get access to a world class public education.

Project overview

The upgrade of Castle Hill Public School will include new fit-for-purpose classrooms and upgraded core facilities to support the growing population of North West Sydney.

The project will deliver a new three-storey building with permanent classrooms, a new hall and canteen, covered outdoor learning area (COLA), and student amenities.

The upgrade will also provide facilities for specialist support classes, and refurbished administration and staff areas.

Progress summary

The main upgrade works for the project started in late 2023 and are being undertaken in several stages to minimise disruption to the school and local community.

Work is progressing on the upgrade. Concrete pours for the new classroom building (building I) have been completed, marking the successful completion of the structural phase for building I.

Work is continuing to install pipes and cables for the new hall and canteen building (building H). Earthworks and soil excavation is taking place to prepare the foundations for the new building H.

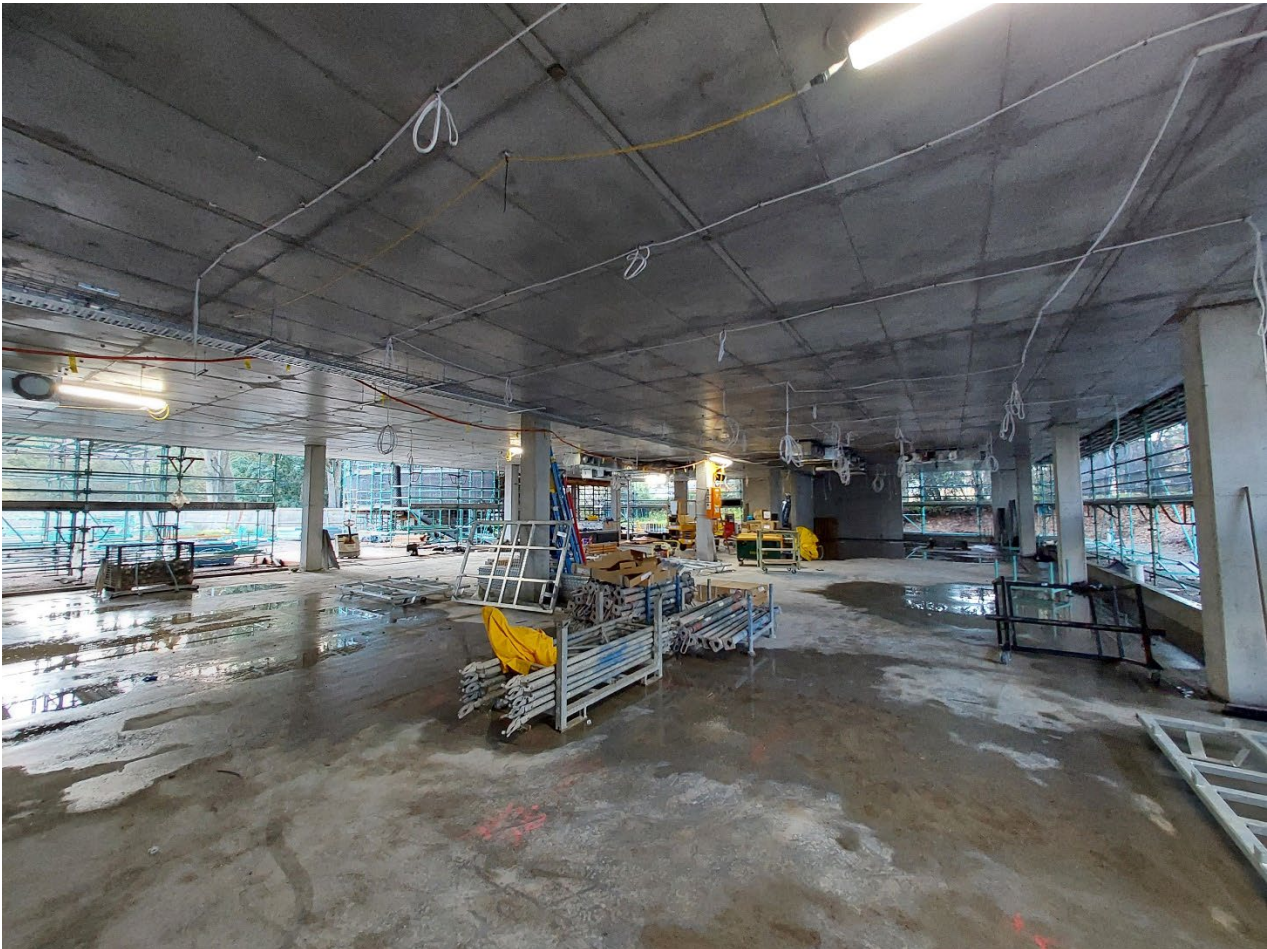
Next steps
