## Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$8.6 billion in school infrastructure over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 160 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This builds on the more than \$9.1 billion invested in projects delivered since 2017, a program of \$17.7 billion in public education infrastructure.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

## Project overview

The upgrade to Cecil Hills High School will provide new learning spaces, new staff facilities, a multipurpose hall, fitness and movement spaces, an upgraded outdoor workshop and accessibility improvements to existing ramps and walkways.

## Progress summary

We have developed a concept design for the school upgrade in consultation with school leadership representatives and the department's technical experts.

The upgrade to Cecil Hills High School is considered a State Significant Development (SSD) and therefore the NSW Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) will assess the development application (DA) for the project.

## Next steps

We will submit a request to DPE for the Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARs) which will tell us the studies that need to be included as part of the application.

Once we receive the SEARS we must prepare a document called an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). An EIS provides a comprehensive description of the project's environmental, social and economic impacts. It includes detailed information on the project scope and design plans, and is the key document for an SSD application. We will continue to refine the design for the upgrade and progress through the development approval process.
