

Concord High School Project update | August 2024



Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild public education, the 2024-25 Budget is delivering record education funding, including \$3.6 billion for new and upgraded schools in Western Sydney. This targeted investment will ensure growing communities get access to a world class public education.

Project overview

The upgraded Concord High School includes 40 new classrooms over 3 new buildings and refurbishment to existing facilities. It includes:

- 32 new standard classrooms
- 5 specialist classrooms and learning spaces for visual arts, performing arts and PDHPE
- a new support learning unit with 3 classrooms
- new front facing administration and staff facilities
- a new school hall
- relocation of library administration to create more space for students and programs
- upgrades to select existing facilities.

Project timeline

Work to prepare for the Concord High School upgrade will start in the week commencing Monday 19 August 2024 with the establishment of perimeter fencing around the construction zone and be followed by demolition in the weeks after. The work will be delivered in stages to minimise the impact to usual school operations.

- **September 2024 – Early 2026:** Demolition of hall and construction of 3 new buildings.
- **Late 2024 – Early 2025:** Extension of the staff carpark and resurfacing of pavement outside the amphitheatre. It is anticipated that this will take place during 2024-25 summer holidays.
- **Early 2026 – Mid 2026:** Refurbishment of the library and existing admin areas. This will start once administration has relocated to the new building.
- **Early 2026 – Mid 2026:** Removal of temporary classrooms, followed by work on new sports courts, bicycle parking and landscaping.

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Minimising construction impacts

Construction can be disruptive and we thank you for your patience while we complete this important school upgrade project.

Usual work hours for the duration of the project will be from 7am to 5pm Monday to Saturday with no work expected on Sundays or public holidays. On occasion work may occur outside these hours. This work will be notified in advance, or if unexpected, as soon as possible after.

We work closely with the construction contractor throughout the project to manage impacts on the school and local community. We expect their support to reduce the impact of the work, with measures including:

- communicating with the school to ensure they are aware of all work happening
- communicating with the wider community when there are disruptive works happening
- monitoring noise levels and locating noisy equipment away from classrooms
- timing very noisy work outside school exams and other important school events
- dust control to keep dust contained within the construction site
- providing pedestrian site worker access through St Luke’s Oval for personal vehicles to park in St Lukes Carpark and to avoid traffic on Stanley Street.
