Investing in our schools

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Cranebrook High School upgrade commencement of construction

The Development Application (DA) to begin construction at Cranebrook High School has been approved by Penrith City Council.

Construction will start on Tuesday 31 August.

Project summary

The new building will provide 3 learning spaces, a shared learning space, a seminar room and a covered outdoor learning area (COLA). (see map on page 3)

Next steps

- Installation of temporary fencing and hoarding (shade cloth) around the perimeter of where the building site is located (see map overleaf).

- Installation of work sheds, toilets, meeting rooms.
- Establishment of erosion and sediment controls.
- Excavation of existing car park.
- Excavation of site.

Construction hours

Construction hours will be 7 am to 5 pm Monday to Friday, and on Saturdays from 7 am till 2 pm. There will be no construction on Sundays or Public Holidays.

Will there be any changes to Kiss and Drop?

No.

How long is the build going to take?

Construction is expected to be completed in mid 2022, weather permitting.

Where will the construction site workers park?

The construction site workers will park on site on a grassed area adjacent to the construction area.

Are the construction vehicles going to use the same entry point as parents and carers?

No. Construction vehicles will enter the site via the school's private access service road off Hosking Street.

It is expected that there will be minimal disruption to usual traffic. However, to ensure the safety of students, staff, the local community and our site workers, traffic management will be implemented when required.

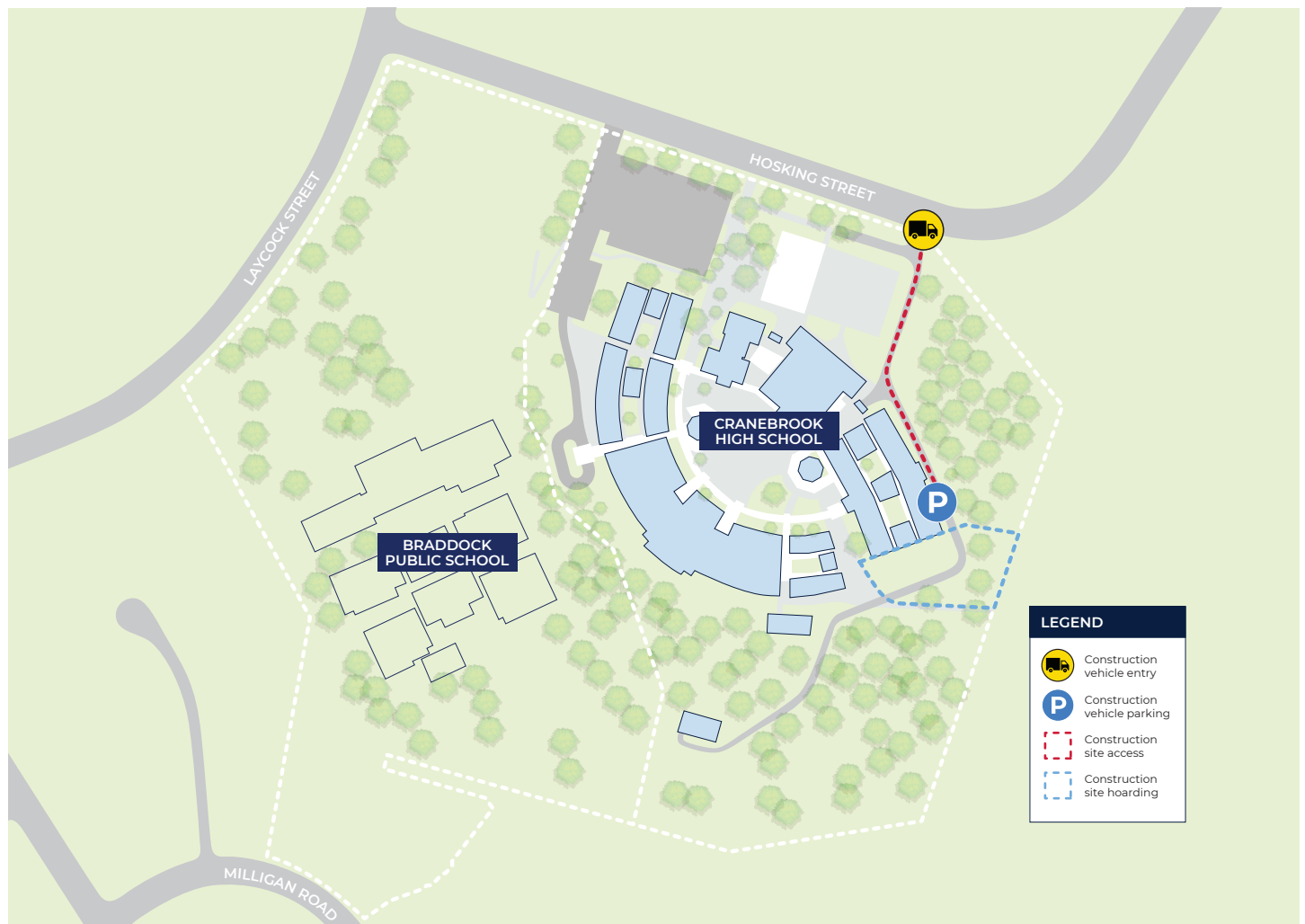
This includes the use of onsite traffic control personnel to manage entry and exit of construction vehicles.

School Infrastructure NSW will work closely with the school community and share regular updates as the project progresses.

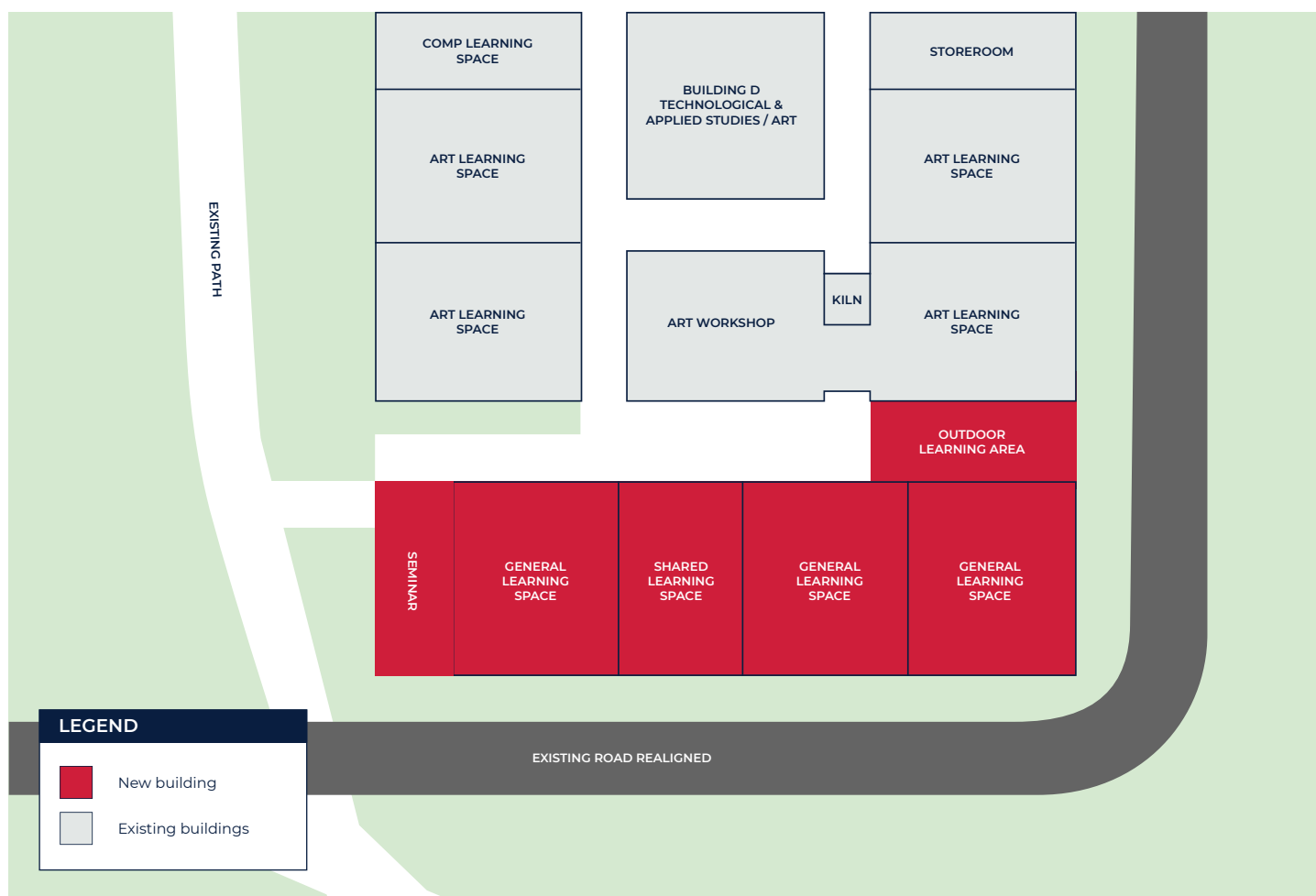
