Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7.9 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 215 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW. The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

A project is underway to upgrade Cranebrook High School by delivering a new homebase building. The new building will provide:

- 3 general learning spaces
- a shared learning space
- a seminar room
- a covered outdoor learning area (COLA).

Progress summary

The construction site has been established and early preparation works are complete. Work has started to demolish the existing internal road and the ground works underway to prepare for the concrete slab.

Next steps

Over the upcoming weeks, demolition and groundworks will be finished and the concrete slab will be poured. Following this structural works will start.

Frequently asked questions

What is being built at Cranebrook High School?

The Cranebrook High School upgrade will deliver a new home base building which will provide learning spaces, a seminar room and a covered outdoor learning area (COLA).

How will the construction site be accessed?

The construction site will be continued to be accessed by contractors via the school's private access service road off Hosking Street.

What are the construction hours?

Construction hours will be between 7 am to 5 pm Monday to Friday, and on Saturdays between 7 am and 2 pm. There will be no construction on Sundays or public holidays, unless otherwise notified.

How will noise and dust be managed?

Noise and dust control measures will be implemented in accordance with planning approval requirements. Noise levels at the site will not exceed the noise control guidelines outlined in the EPA Environmental Noise Control Manual for construction and demolition works.

Measures to control dust will be implemented during construction, including the hosing of dust on all unsealed areas as required and reduced construction.

How will the community be kept safe during construction?

The safety of the school and the local community is our highest priority. Throughout the entire construction period rigorous safety and security measures will be put in place. There will be regular consultation with the school to discuss construction progress and minimise impacts to school operations.

When will construction be finished?

The project is anticipated to be finished by mid 2022.

How can I keep informed?
