Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$8.6 billion in school infrastructure over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 160 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This builds on the more than \$9.1 billion invested in projects delivered since 2017, a program of \$17.7 billion in public education infrastructure.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

A project is underway to upgrade Cronulla High School to meet enrolment growth. The upgrade will deliver:

- 10 new permanent learning spaces
- a new canteen
- new administration areas and
- upgraded student and staff amenities.

Progress summary and next steps

The shade structure which was previously attached to building B has successfully been relocated and attached to building D within the forecourt. We are finalising the Review of Environmental Factors (REF) for the project and are working with the building contractor to finish the design of the new buildings and works program. Once the design and REF are approved, we will proceed to establish the construction site in preparation for the construction works to begin. This will include:

- putting in temporary fencing and hoarding (shade cloth) around the perimeter of construction site
- putting in work sheds, toilets and meeting rooms
- establishing erosion and sediment controls.

More information will be shared with the community before site establishment.
