Investing in our schools

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Croydon Public School

A project is underway to upgrade Croydon Public School. The upgrade will include:

- One new building with 18 learning and teaching spaces
- Heritage building refurbishment for administration and staff
- A library, hall and special programs room refurbishment
- A new canteen
- Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA) and walkway.

Progress summary

School administration and staff moved into Building E, after the refurbishment was recently completed.

Work to refurbish Building A has now started. External staged works are also progressing well on the site.

School holiday works

Work on Building A will continue, including installing a new lift. External works will be completed throughout the school.

Work to connect to a nearby substation will take place on 6-17 July 2020. Traffic controllers will be on Boundary Street during these works to guide pedestrians and vehicles past the works zone.

A new water pipe will be connected on Young Street during the first week of school holidays, on 8-9 July 2020. Traffic controllers will be on Young Street to guide pedestrians and vehicles past the works zone.

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Frequently asked questions

What are the construction working hours?

Construction work will take place from Monday to Saturday, from 7:00AM to 5:00PM. If required, Sunday work will take place between 8:00AM and 12:00PM.

Please note that in line with the NSW Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID-19 Development – Construction Work Days) Order 2020, School Infrastructure NSW construction sites can now operate on weekends and public holidays during the COVID-19 pandemic.

This allows workers to maintain social distance by spreading out work across the week.

What safety measures will be in place?

The health and safety of the community are our highest priorities. Site fencing and banner mesh surrounds the construction site to prevent access. Gates and fences are closed at all times.

Traffic control is in place to help vehicles turn into and out of the site safely. Vehicles give way to pedestrians at all times.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Some noisy works will take place during the holiday period, while students are not at school. As much as possible, noisy works will happen between midmorning and mid-afternoon.

Full dust suppression measures are in place across all areas of the site, including shade cloth fencing and trucks being regularly hosed down.

How will traffic be managed?

Traffic control and security measures will be in place where required for the safety of the community.

Boundary Street road works

Work will take place on Boundary Street from Monday 6 July to Friday 17 July 2020.

Street parking on the southern side of Boundary St will be restricted during these works. A traffic controller will be in place to guide pedestrians and motorists around the works zone and footpath.

Resident access will be maintained at all times.

Young Street road works

Traffic flow will be reduced to one lane between Gibbs Street and Boundary Street during works on Young Street on Wednesday 8 July - Thursday 9 July 2020.

Two traffic controllers will be in place to guide pedestrians and motorists around the works.

Resident access will be maintained at all times.
