Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over the next four years to deliver 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Croydon Public School

A project is underway to upgrade Croydon Public School. The upgrade will deliver new flexible learning spaces to meet expected demand and upgrade of core facilities including the hall, canteen, library, administration buildings and outdoor learning spaces.

Progress summary

Stage 1 main works, under a REF complying development consent, have been approved with a tender for construction awarded to Stephen Edwards Constructions. The development application (DA) for Stage 2 main works has now been approved by Burwood Council and tender for Stage 2 works will commence in early 2020 with works expected to start in mid 2020.

Site establishment and works commencement

Site establishment will commence in December 2019 to prepare the site for construction. This will be followed by main works.

Construction will take place between 7.00am and 5.00pm Monday to Friday, and 8.00am and 1.00pm on Saturdays. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays unless approval and notification is provided.

During construction, traffic management will be implemented to ensure the safety of students, teachers, staff, site visitors and residents.

Measures will be in place to mitigate noise and dust levels, including hoarding, hosing down of vehicles as required. Deliveries will be scheduled outside of pick up and drop off times where possible.

School Infrastructure NSW will work closely with the school community and neighbours to minimise impacts where possible.





Frequently asked questions

When is the project expected to be completed?

The upgrade to Croydon Public School is due for completion in late 2021.

How will noise during construction be managed?

The construction program has been designed to minimise the impacts of noise for students, staff and neighbours. Particular focus has been placed on ensuring there is minimal noise during school hours.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Hoarding and shade cloth will be used to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and its neighbours. Dust from demolition and construction works will be hosed down with water as required. Trucks entering and leaving the site will cover their loads and be washed down to prevent tracking dust and mud from the site.

Will the Croydon Public school entrance change?

No. School entrances will remain the same.

Will staff car parking change?

Yes. Staff car parking on the school site will be affected. Any access changes that are required during construction will be clearly communicated to the school to allow sufficient time to plan for changes.

Will tree removal be required?

Yes. Some trees have been identified for removal to allow for the new building. These trees will be replaced on site as part of the landscaping works.

Will students be relocated during the upgrade?

Students affected by the change were relocated to demountable classrooms on the school site in mid 2019.
