Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over four years to deliver more than 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Curl Curl North Public School

We are upgrading Curl Curl North Public School with new and improved education facilities for students.

This upgrade will include:

- 40 permanent teaching spaces
- a new hall and canteen
- a new library
- a new administration building
- upgraded playground and sports facilities.

Progress and next steps

Stage 2 works are progressing well. The in ground remediation works have finished earlier than previously communicated. Main works construction such as excavating and installing footings and foundations for the new hall and canteen is well progressed.

Construction hours will be 7:00am to 6:00pm Monday to Friday and 8:00am to 1:00pm on Saturdays.

No works will take place on Sundays or public holidays unless notified. The community will be kept informed of any changes to the standard working hours

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Frequently asked questions

What is being delivered in Stage 2 of the upgrade of Curl Curl North Public School?

The project is being staged to allow school operations to continue during the upgrade. Stage 2 of the upgrade includes:

- demolition of buildings and construction of a new hall and canteen (Block D)
- construction of toilets (Block E)
- refurbishment and extension of OOSH facilities (Block L)
- groundworks, external works and landscaping
- construction of a new basketball court and sports field

What are the construction working hours?

Works will take place from 7:00am to 6:00pm Monday to Friday and 8:00am to 1:00pm on Saturdays. No works will take place on Sundays or public holidays unless notified. The community will be kept informed of any changes to the approved working hours.

How is the operational area of the school separated from the construction area?

The construction site is separated with a hoarding.

Will there be any changes to the existing bus stop locations and/or the kiss and drop location?

There are no change to the existing bus stop locations. The new kiss and drop is located on the southern end of Playfair Road.

How will traffic be managed?

Traffic management will be in place where required for the safety of students, staff, the local community and workers. Traffic controllers will be used where required to manage entry and exit of vehicles to and from the construction site. Vehicles will give way to pedestrians at all times.

Where is the construction vehicle access point?

The construction vehicle access points are on Playfair Road. There are two access points, one on the most northern end of the Stage 2 construction zone and one on the most southern end of the Stage 2 construction zone.

Deliveries will only be made during construction hours and outside of pick up and drop off times to minimise disruption to neighbours and the school community.
