Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild public education, the 2025-26 Budget is delivering \$3.9 billion for new and upgraded schools in Western Sydney. This targeted investment will ensure growing communities get access to a world class public education.

Project overview

The upgrade to Dalmeny Public School will deliver new permanent classrooms to replace demountable buildings at the school. The building will contain 16 new classrooms, amenities and a lift for accessibility.

Progress summary

The construction contract for the upgrade at Dalmeny Public School is expected to be awarded in early July. Once the contract has been awarded, we will prepare a construction timeline for the project.

Next steps

In August, the site will be prepared for construction to begin. This will include installing fencing, delivering site sheds, surveying the site and bringing in necessary machinery for the upgrade works to start.

We will provide the construction timeline once the contractor is on board, and we finalise the details. Construction on the new building will start in early September and is expected to be completed by late 2026, ready for students on Day 1, Term 1 2027.

Minimising construction impacts

Construction can be disruptive, and we thank you for your patience while we complete this important school upgrade project.

Once we appoint a construction contractor, we will provide further information about their working hours and works to be completed. We will notify you in advance about any scheduled work, and if unexpected issues arise, we will inform you as quickly as possible.

We work closely with the construction contractor throughout the project to manage impacts on the school and local community. We expect their support to reduce the impact of the work, with measures including:

- communicating with the school to ensure they are aware of all work happening
- communicating with the wider community when there are disruptive works happening
- monitoring noise levels and locating noisy equipment away from classrooms
- timing very noisy work outside school exams and other important school events
- dust control to keep dust contained within the construction site
