Project update

Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over four years to deliver more than 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Fairvale High School

A project is underway to upgrade Fairvale High School. The project will increase the school's capacity and includes:

- 30 permanent teaching spaces including specialised classrooms for science, technology and food technology
- New multipurpose hall including gym facilities, stage and canteen
- Improved outdoor play space, including a new covered outdoor learning area (COLA)
- New and expanded staff administration facilities
- Demolition of the Bini Dome
- Associated landscaping

Main works construction commencement

March 2020

Construction is scheduled to start on Monday 23 March.

Work will take place between 7:00am to 6:00pm Monday to Friday and 8:00am and 1:00pm on Saturdays. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays unless approval and notification is provided.

During construction you may notice an increase in vehicles entering and leaving the site and increased noise due to construction activities. Mitigation measures will be in place to manage traffic, noise and dust levels, including hoarding, hosing down as required and deliveries will be scheduled outside of pick up and drop off times where possible. School Infrastructure NSW will continue to work closely with the school community and neighbours to minimise project impacts where possible.

Frequently asked questions

Is there an impact to current school operations?

No. The school will continue to operate as usual during Term 1.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Hoarding and shade cloth have been erected to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and our neighbours.

Dust from demolition and construction works will be hosed down with water as required.

How will traffic be managed?

Construction vehicle movements and deliveries will be scheduled outside of peak school operation times.

Traffic management will be in place where required to manage vehicles entering and exiting the site.

How will you keep us informed?

We will keep you informed by holding information booths at the school, issuing project updates via letterbox drops, website updates and through the school newsletter.
