Project update

Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6 billion over the next four years to deliver more than 170 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over four years, along with a record \$500 million for the sustainable Cooler Classrooms program to provide air conditioning to schools. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Greenwich Public School

A project is underway to upgrade the Kingslangley Road and Greenwich Road campuses of Greenwich Public School. The project will deliver flexible learning spaces for 670 students by 2020.

The Kingslangley Road campus upgrade will include 18 new permanent teaching spaces, a new library, two existing permanent teaching spaces converted to special programs rooms, and an upgrade to core facilities including the canteen, staff and administration amenities and the hall.

The Greenwich Road campus upgrade will include 8 new permanent teaching spaces, two existing teaching spaces converted to special programs rooms and an upgrade to the existing administration building.

Progress summary

Site establishment has been completed and main construction work has commenced. The design is being finalised.

Next Steps

Main construction work is ongoing. Construction will take place between 7am and 6pm Monday to Friday and between 8am and 4pm on Saturdays, excluding public holidays, and will continue over the school holidays.
