Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6 billion over the next four years to deliver more than 170 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over four years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Harrington Park Public School

A project is underway to upgrade Harrington Park Public School. This upgrade includes 19 new permanent innovative learning spaces, new staff and administration facilities, a new covered outdoor learning area (COLA) and an upgrade to the school hall and library.

Project summary

Works continued over the Term 1 school holidays with the relocation of the cricket pitch. Early works are expected to be completed by mid 2019. The project team remains in consultation with local council regarding traffic management for the upgrade.

Project update

A tender for construction is expected to be released for Stage 2 main works in mid 2019 and the contractor will be announced in late 2019.

Pending the appointment of the contractor, works will begin to build the new school hall and administration facilities.

FAQs

What is being delivered?

The upgrade to Harrington Park Public School will deliver 19 new permanent innovative learning spaces, new staff and administration facilities, a new covered outdoor learning area (COLA) and an upgrade to the school hall and library.

When will main construction works start?

Pending the appointment of the contractor, main construction works are expected to begin in late 2019.

Is this a staged project?

Yes this project will be delivered in three stages.

Stage 1 – car park works expected to be completed by mid 2019.

Stage 2 – new hall, administration building and library expected to be completed by 2019-2020.

Stage 3 – new teaching spaces block, external works and landscaping expected to be completed by 2020-2021.

Will there be any changes to parking during construction?

Yes a new onsite carpark will replace the existing carpark for teachers and staff.

What will works hours be?

Works will take place 7am to 5pm Monday to Friday, and 8am to 5pm on Saturdays. No works will take place on Sundays or public holidays unless notified.

Will traffic management be used?

The project team is currently in consultation with local council regarding traffic management for the upgrade. We will keep the community updated about traffic management as the project progresses.

Will there be any changes to the kiss and drop zone during construction?

No there will be no changes to the kiss and drop zone during construction.

Will students be required to relocate during construction?

Demountable classrooms will be relocated on site to allow for the construction of new buildings. There will be enough classrooms operational for all current and future students on site.

When will the project be completed?

The project is expected to be completed in mid 2021.

Will the demountable classrooms be removed?

All demountable classrooms will be removed at the end of the project and will be replaced by permanent teaching spaces.

Who is the architect for the project?

The project architect is SARM.

How will the community be kept informed?

We will keep the school and local community informed through project notifications, information booths, school newsletters, drop-in sessions and website updates.
