## Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$8.6 billion in school infrastructure over the next 4 years, continuing its program to deliver 160 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This builds on the more than \$9.1 billion invested in projects delivered since 2017, a program of \$17.7 billion in public education infrastructure.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

# Project overview

We are upgrading Hastings Secondary College to support the student community. Hastings Secondary College comprises of the Port Macquarie Campus (PMC) and Westport Campus (WPC). The upgrade will involve works at both campuses.

The Port Macquarie Campus will deliver new and upgraded learning spaces, new Technological and Applied Studies (TAS) facilities, new Creative and Performing Arts (CAPA) building, a redeveloped school entry and a new shared use multi-sports facility in partnership with Police Citizens Youth Clubs (PCYC) NSW.

The Westport Campus will deliver relocated and upgraded administration office, new flexible learning spaces and a redeveloped school entry.



#### Project overview - Shared use multi-sports facility

The Department of Education will be providing a new shared use multi-sports facility at the Port Macquarie Campus as part of the Hastings Secondary College upgrade, in partnership with Police Citizens Youth Clubs NSW (PCYC).

The shared use multi-sports facility will include 2 multi-purpose sports courts, gymnastics facilities, multipurpose rooms, a gymnasium, a Clontarf Academy, and other additional facilities.

The shared use multi-sports facility will have two entrances, one within Port Macquarie Campus for staff and students and one public-use entrance.

## Progress summary - Shared use multi-sports facility

A construction contract for the new shared use multi-sports facility at the Port Macquarie Campus as part of the Hastings Secondary College has been awarded to AW Edwards. We will continue to work with the appointed contractor and their design team, in consultation with the school and the PCYC, to progress the detailed design and develop the program of works to deliver the new multi-sports facility.

We will keep you updated as the project progresses.

#### **Next steps**

- Finalise the detailed design for the shared use multi-sports facility.
- Setting up site establishment which includes the site offices, fences, ablution blocks etc.
- Obtain Construction Works Certificate (CWC) to start construction works.
- At this stage, construction is anticipated to start in early November.
- The TAS building is progressing well.
