

Hurlstone Agricultural High School

Works notification | 28 March 2024

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild essential services, the 2023-24 Budget is delivering a record \$8.8 billion for new and upgraded schools. This targeted investment in growing communities will ensure working families get access to a world class public education. This includes an upgrade to Hurlstone Agricultural High School.

Changed traffic conditions

Next month, road users travelling along Roy Watts Rd may experience altered traffic conditions as road works to support construction of the new farm hub are completed.

From Monday 1 April 2024 to Friday 26 April 2024, between the off-peak hours of 9:30am to 2:00pm, a partial road closure will be in place while road trenching and sewage works are completed.

As previously notified, the trenching works were scheduled to take place from 20 November 2023. A reschedule has been required to accommodate the changing requirements of the energy services provider.

“Road trenching” is the process whereby thin strips of pavement and earth are removed, before being replaced along with a new road surface. These works are being completed to lay new electrical cables and connect the new farm office to an electrical substation.

These works will take place on Roy Watts Rd near the entrance to the school administration building and the staff carpark (see map overleaf).

The sewage works involve connecting the sewage line between the main farm hub and the sheep shed.

Traffic controllers, road safety barriers and signage will be in place to ensure the safety and convenience of road users during these off-peak hours while trenching works are completed.

Vehicles will be able to travel in both directions along Roy Watts Rd, although only one side of the road will be open to the pedestrians.

Road users may experience minor delays during off-peak times. Road users travelling during peak times will not be impacted – works will cease and the road will be open as per normal.

We thank you for your support and understanding while these works are completed as part of this important school upgrade project.

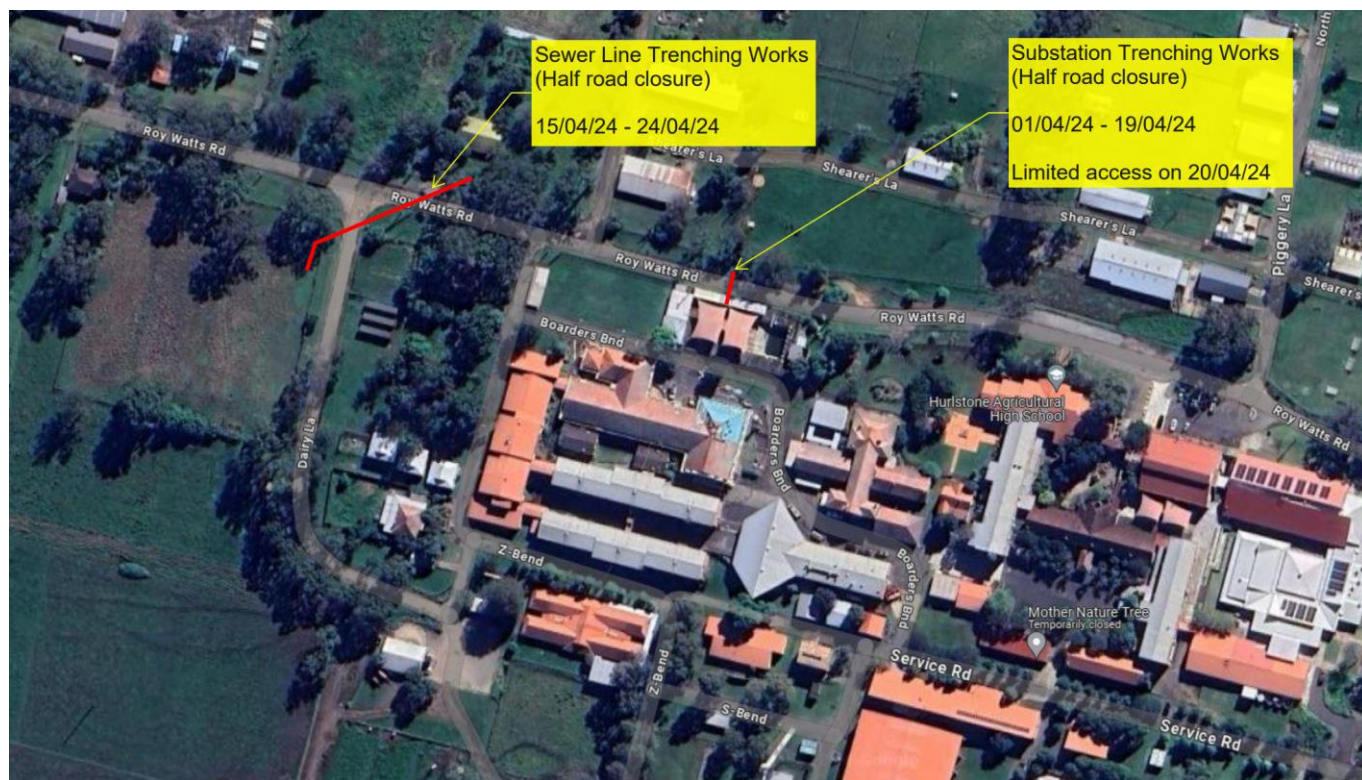
Disruption to power supply

Related to these works, on **Saturday 20 April 2024** a 10-hour power shutdown will occur from 7am to 5pm while the new farm office is connected to the electrical network. There will be no electrical supply to Hurlstone Agricultural High School and the Glenfield Education Office during this time.

There will be no disruption to other utilities – gas, water and telephone services will continue to operate as normal.
