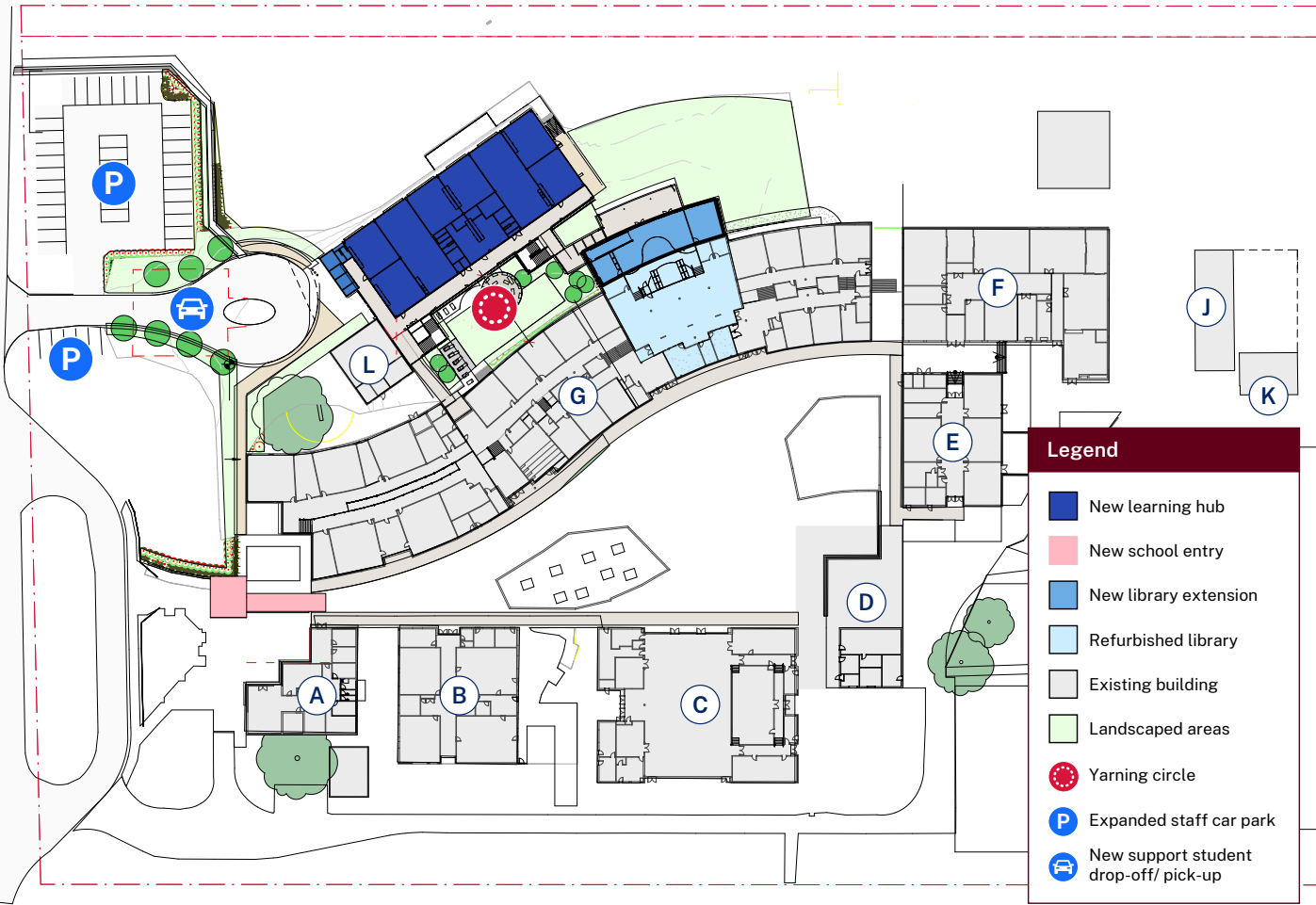
Thank you for your ongoing support, and I look forward to witnessing the positive impact this new building will have on our students' educational experiences.

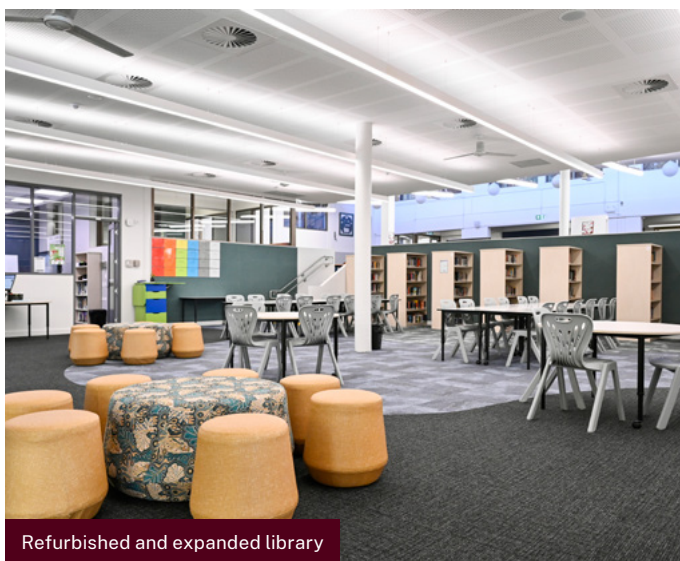
Connecting with Country
