Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government’s plan to rebuild essential services, the 2023-24 Budget is delivering a historic \$1.4 billion for new and upgraded schools in regional NSW. This targeted investment in growing communities will ensure working families get access to world class public education.

The 2023-24 Budget committed funding to progress with an expansion of Jerrabomberra High School.

Day one Term one at Jerrabomberra High School

The new permanent high school opened to year 7 students on Thursday 1 February and for years 8 and 9 students on Friday 2 February 2024.



Removing demountables from Jerrabomberra Public School

Now that the new permanent high school is open, we are removing the demountable buildings from Jerrabomberra Public School. Work has started to remove the footings, piers and inground services for these structures.

Removing the demountables by truck will continue for a few weeks until late April.

New playground for Jerrabomberra Public School – coming soon!

Once the demountables are gone and depending on good weather, it will take between six to eight weeks to prepare the area for installing a new playground at the Public School.

The old equipment could not be reinstated as it no longer meets current safety standards. New playground equipment including a shade structure and soft fall was ordered in consultation with Jerrabomberra Public School's Principal.

We anticipate the new playground to be installed by late June 2024.

Next steps

The Stage 2 development application for Jerrabomberra High School is now being assessed by Queanbeyan-Palerang Regional Council. Following assessment by Queanbeyan-Palerang Regional Council, the development application will be determined by the Southern Regional Planning Panel. The Panel includes three independent experts appointed by the Minister for Planning and two Council representatives.

Stage 2 expands the school capacity to 1,000 students with another building for 18 classrooms, a vocational education and training kitchen and a semi-commercial kitchen.
