Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver more than 200 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

School Infrastructure NSW (SINSW) is undertaking planning for a new education campus at Jindabyne, building a new primary and high school within the Sport and Recreation Precinct.

Once complete, students and staff from the Jindabyne Central School will relocate to form two new schools within the Jindabyne Education Campus.

Once the transition is complete the existing school site will cease to operate.

Progress summary

During this critical planning phase, we are continuing to consult stakeholders, undertake assessments and due diligence, and prepare reports that will be submitted as part of the State Significant Development Application.
