Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over four years to deliver more than 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across New South Wales. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Jordan Springs Public School

A project is underway to provide a new K-6 public school for Jordan Springs. The school includes:

- 27 innovative learning spaces
- a library and a hall
- a covered outdoor learning area
- modern core facilities such as staff and administration areas.

Progress summary

Construction of the school is advancing well with all buildings and decking now finished. We recently started working on the drop off and pick up areas and landscaping.

Term 1 holiday works

Work will continue over the Term 1 holiday including:

- landscaping and play areas
- school drop off and pick up areas
- installing furniture, fixtures, and other equipment inside buildings.

Work hours are 7:00am to 6:00pm Monday to Friday and 8:00am to 1:00pm Saturdays. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays. The site will be patrolled by security after hours and on public holidays.

Dust and noise control measures are in place to reduce the impact on local residents. Traffic control and security will be used where required. We will ensure disruptions to the wider community are minimised.

Frequently asked questions

Will construction take place over Easter?

Site works will continue over Term 1 holidays. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays.

What safety measures will be in place?

The health and safety of the community is our highest priority. Temporary fencing has been installed around the construction site to secure the area and prevent public access. The site will also be patrolled by security after hours and on public holidays.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

The contractor will continue to implement dust and noise control measures. Dust and noise are minimised with hoarding, shade cloth and spraying water.

How will traffic be managed?

Traffic management will be in place where required for the safety of the local community and workers. Traffic controllers will be used to manage entry and exit of vehicles to and from the construction site as necessary. Vehicles will give way to pedestrians at all times.

When will construction be complete?

Construction is progressing well with all remaining work to be completed in the coming months before the school opens on Day 1, Term 3, 2020. Once the work is complete, site sheds will be dismantled and removed from site.

When will the school be operational?

The school will be operational on Day 1, Term 3, 2020.

What is the catchment area?

The NSW Department of Education has confirmed the school catchment area.

It is bounded by The Northern Road to the west, Ninth Avenue to the north, the northern edge of the suburbs of Werrington Downs, Werrington County and Cambridge Gardens to the south and South Creek to the east.
