Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6 billion over the next four years to deliver more than 170 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$847 million is being spent on school maintenance over four years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Killara High School upgrade

A project is underway at Killara High School.

The project will deliver 17 new permanent teaching spaces, as well as upgrades to some of the school's existing core facilities.

Progress summary

The design of the school upgrade has been completed.

Early works are underway and learning spaces and facilities are expected to be completed by mid 2020.

Summer school holiday works

Works will continue during the summer holiday period.

The upgrade to Killara High School requires tree removal works and the demolition of the House building.

We are here to make sure that work is completed safely and efficiently. During this time we will be working collaboratively with the school community and neighbours to ensure that disruptions to the community are minimised.

Frequently asked questions

What works will be completed over the holidays?

During January 2019 works will include:

- tree removal in accordance with DA consent
- internal strip out of the House building and removal of materials
- demolition of House structure
- removal of materials from the site in trucks.

No works will take place on public holidays and Sundays.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Hoarding and shade cloth will be erected to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and our neighbours. Dust from demolition and construction works will be hosed down with water as required.

How will traffic be managed?

Traffic management will be in place where required to manage vehicles entering and exiting the site.

How will the removal of asbestos materials be managed?

Materials containing asbestos have been identified within the House structure and will be removed prior to the demolition.

The health, safety and well-being of students, staff and our neighbours is our highest priority, and all necessary measures will be implemented to ensure that the material is removed safely.

This work will be carried out by a licensed asbestos removal contractor and will be conducted in accordance with the Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan and Safe Work NSW requirements.

Please be aware that removal of asbestos will pose no risk to staff, students or the local community. The asbestos on site is classified as

"non-friable", which means it is bonded with other materials (such as cement or vinyl) and cannot be crumbled or powdered by light pressure.

How will you keep us informed during construction?

School infrastructure NSW will continue to share construction updates and project information as the project progresses. We will provide information through information booths, project updates, our website and school newsletters.

We encourage members from the community to participate in upcoming information booths to provide feedback and ideas. The time and location of future information booths will be advertised in the local newspaper and on the School Infrastructure NSW website.
