Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over the next four years to deliver 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Killara High School upgrade

A project is underway at Killara High School. The project will deliver 15 new permanent teaching spaces, two specialist spaces, and upgrades to some of the school's existing core facilities.

Progress summary

The design of the school upgrade is being finalised.

Works on the new building have commenced. The building footings, block work and storm water services connection were completed during Term 2 and over the school holidays.

The school upgrade is expected to be completed by mid 2020.

Next steps

The new building will continue to take shape during Term 3.

The ground floor and first floor concrete slabs will be poured, and block work will continue.

To support this work, there will be an increase in vehicles entering and existing the site along Churchill Road.

During this time, we will be working collaboratively with the school community and neighbours to ensure that disruptions to the community are minimised.

We are committed to sharing information as the project progresses.

Frequently asked questions

Is there an impact to current school operations?

No. School operations during Term 3 will continue as usual.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Hoarding and shade cloth will be erected to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and our neighbours. Dust from demolition and construction works will be hosed down with water as required.

How will traffic be managed?

Construction vehicle movements and deliveries will be scheduled outside of peak school operation times.

Traffic management will be in place where required to manage vehicles entering and exiting the site from Churchill Road.

How will you keep us informed?

We will keep you informed by holding information booths at the school, issuing project updates via letterbox drops, website updates and through the school newsletter.
