Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over the next four years to deliver 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Killara High School upgrade

A project is underway at Killara High School. The project will deliver 15 new permanent teaching spaces, two specialist spaces, and upgrades to some of the school's existing core facilities.

Progress summary

The design of the school upgrade is now complete. In the past few months, the building contractor has completed the building's foundations and the main structure. During the past school holidays, the contractor also connected the new building's services.

The school upgrade is expected to be completed by mid 2020.

Next steps

The new building will continue to take shape during Term 4.

The external concrete staircase will be poured, and roof installation will occur. To support this work, there will be an increase in vehicles entering and exiting the site along Churchill Road.

Facade works will also be underway in parallel with bricklaying to continue in this period.

During this time, we will be working collaboratively with the school community and neighbours to ensure that disruptions to the community are minimised.
