Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6 billion over the next four years to deliver more than 170 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over four years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Killara High School upgrade

A project is underway at Killara High School to deliver 17 new permanent teaching spaces, as well as upgrades to some of the school's existing core facilities.

Progress summary

The detailed design of the school upgrade is currently being finalised.

In parallel to the design finalisation, the building contractor has established the site with ground works well underway.

The school upgrade is expected to be completed by mid-2020.

Next steps

Construction works will continue on the site along Churchill Road. During this time, we will be working collaboratively with the school community and neighbours to ensure that disruptions to the community are minimised.

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Frequently asked questions

What works will take place in June?

The building contractor will continue the construction works which includes the following activities:

- Completion of the building's footings
- Concrete pour for the under-croft slab
- Installation of inground services

Is there an impact to current school operations?

No. School operations during Term 2 will continue as usual.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Hoarding and shade cloth have been erected to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and our neighbours.

Dust from demolition and construction works will be hosed down with water as required.

How will traffic be managed?

Construction vehicle movements and deliveries will be scheduled outside of peak school operation times.

Traffic management will be in place where required to manage vehicles entering and exiting the site.

How will the removal of hazardous materials be managed?

The health, safety and well-being of students, staff, visitors and our neighbours is our highest priority.

As such, asbestos removal works took place over a weekend in April 2019 by a licenced accredited asbestos removal contractor in accordance with the Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan and Safe Work NSW requirements. The site has now been cleared of asbestos and poses no threat, with construction works continuing. Air monitoring and site fencing will remain in place during the build.

How will you keep us informed?

We will keep you informed by holding information booths at the school, issuing project updates via letterbox drops, website updates and through the school newsletter.
