An upgrade is underway at Killarney Heights Public School. The project will deliver seven new permanent teaching spaces and a special programs room.

Progress summary

The school upgrade remains on-track for completion by mid-2020.

Work continues on roofing, external cladding, services installation and internal fit-out.

Over the holidays, work will include:

- preparation for the installation of the new electrical substation near the main entrance
- removal of the external scaffolding in stages
- electrical mains connection through the existing school site.

Due to the nature of our work, you may experience increased noise from machinery and other activities.

We will ensure that work is completed safely and efficiently, and disruptions are minimised.

Our contractors will ensure their teams comply with social distancing restrictions to ensure a safe workplace.
