Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7.9 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 215 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

Kingscliff High School is being upgraded to provide new permanent learning spaces and core facilities. The scope of work includes a new creative and performing arts building, a new library, a new senior learning environment, refurbished hospitality facilities and general learning spaces, and a new sports pavilion.

Progress summary

School Infrastructure NSW obtained the necessary planning consents to proceed with upgrades to Kingscliff High School on Wednesday 3 November, 2021. Summer holiday works

Site establishment activities to prepare for main works construction will start in the week commencing Monday 20 December 2021. These works will include the delivery of heavy machinery and equipment and the installation of construction fencing and signage.

Following site establishment main works will start. This will include service upgrades and construction of the new COLA. Work will continue throughout the school holidays to ensure we can maximise delivery while students are not on site.

School infrastructure NSW will continue to work closely with the school leadership team to ensure continuity of operations and to minimise any potential impacts to learning during construction.

Traffic management

Construction vehicle access to the works zone will be from the Oxford Street school entry. Site vehicles will give way to pedestrians at all times, and where possible deliveries to the site will be made outside of peak traffic periods. Traffic controllers will be in place to assist with the management of oversized deliveries to site. Construction workers will comply with local parking regulations and access to private properties will be maintained at all times.

Work hours

Standard construction working hours will be 7:00am to 6:00pm Monday to Friday, and 8:00am to 1:00pm on Saturdays. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays unless otherwise notified. Over the upcoming summer holiday period no work will take place Monday 27 December, Tuesday 28 December 2021 and Monday 3 January, 2022)

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
