Project update

Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7.9 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 215 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

Kingscliff High School is being upgraded to provide new permanent teaching spaces and core facilities. The scope of work includes a new creative and performing arts building, new library, new senior learning environment, refurbished hospitality facilities and general learning spaces, and new sports pavilion.

Progress summary

As per our project update in November 2021, School Infrastructure NSW has obtained the necessary planning consents to proceed with upgrades to Kingscliff High School. Next steps

Site establishment activities to prepare for main works construction will start in the week commencing Monday 20 December 2021. These works will include the delivery of heavy machinery and equipment and the installation of construction fencing and signage.

Following site establishment main works will start. This will include service upgrades, construction of the new COLA and refurbishment of existing classrooms. Work will continue throughout the school holidays to ensure we can maximise delivery while students are not on site.

As part of the consent to undertake these works, the project is required to develop a Construction Environmental Management Plan to outline how it will manage any impacts to nearby local residents. These impacts include noise, vibration and vehicle movements.

Managing construction impacts

Activity	How we propose to minimise or manage the impact on nearby residents
General	 We will provide advance notice of work and consult the local community, particularly when we anticipate high noise generating works. Noise levels on site will be managed in accordance with noise control guidelines outlined in the EPA Environmental Noise Control Manual for construction and demolition works. Construction works, including the delivery of materials to and from the site, are proposed to take place between: 7:00am and 6:00pm Mondays to Fridays 8:00am and 1:00pm on Saturdays No work is currently proposed for Sundays or public holidays. We will provide advance notice if any work is approved to take place outside of the above hours.
Construction	Measures to manage high noise generating works such as piling and similar activities in line with noise reducing work practices: Proposed actions:
	 High noise generating works will be managed to reduce the impact to local residents by implementing shorter time periods or alternating with quieter work methods, where practical. If rock breaking, rock hammering, sheet piling, pile driving and similar activities are required, effective equipment should be chosen, and respite periods for local residents may be put in place. These activities only may be carried out between the following hours:
	 9:00am to 12:00pm, Monday to Friday 2:00pm to 5:00pm, Monday to Friday 9:00am to 12:00pm, Saturday.
	 Ensure workers and contractors are regularly trained (such as toolbox talks) to use equipment in ways to minimise noise.
Construction	 Measures to ensure road safety and network efficiency during construction. Proposed actions: Construction vehicles will not arrive at the site or surrounding residential precincts outside of approved construction hours. Construction vehicles will be well maintained and will be required to observe speed limits. Trucks will only use approved truck routes to and from the site. We will provide advance notice of any works that will impact access to residents or change local traffic conditions.
Construction	Mechanism for the community to discuss or provide feedback regarding construction impacts. Proposed actions:
