Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7.9 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 215 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

Kingscliff Public School is being upgraded to provide new permanent learning spaces and core facilities to cater for enrolment growth in the area. The scope of work includes replacement of all classrooms including demountable buildings, a new library, an extended hall with new canteen, new outdoor spaces and a redeveloped school entry.

Progress summary

Works to upgrade Kingscliff Public School have been affected by the recent floods in Northern NSW. While construction at Kingscliff Public School was not directly impacted by floodwaters, the flooding in Northern NSW has had a considerable impact on the availability of contractors and suppliers in the region.

Our contractor, Richard Crookes is continuing with works at a reduced capacity and are currently revising the program of works for the remainder of the upgrade. School infrastructure NSW will keep the community updated with the new program for the upgrade once available.

Next steps


Works approved under the State Significant Development (SSD) application for the Kingscliff Public School upgrade will start on Wednesday 1 June 2022, weather permitting.

Upcoming work activities will include:

- installing additional temporary construction fencing and hoardings around the work site
- removing trees and vegetation within the new works zone
- demolishing existing buildings within the new works zone
- ongoing construction of the new administration building
- excavating and installing foundations for the two new homebase buildings.



Work hours

Standard working hours will be 7am to 5pm, Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm, Saturday. There will be no work on Sundays or public holidays, unless otherwise notified.

Traffic management

Construction vehicles access to the works zone will be from Sutherland Street only. Site vehicles will give way to pedestrians at all times, and where possible deliveries to the site will be made outside of peak traffic periods. Traffic controllers will be in place to assist with the management of oversized deliveries to site.

Parking

Construction workers will be reminded to comply with local parking regulations and access to private properties will be maintained at all times. Both Orient Street and Sutherland Street will remain accessible for parent parking, unless otherwise notified.

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
