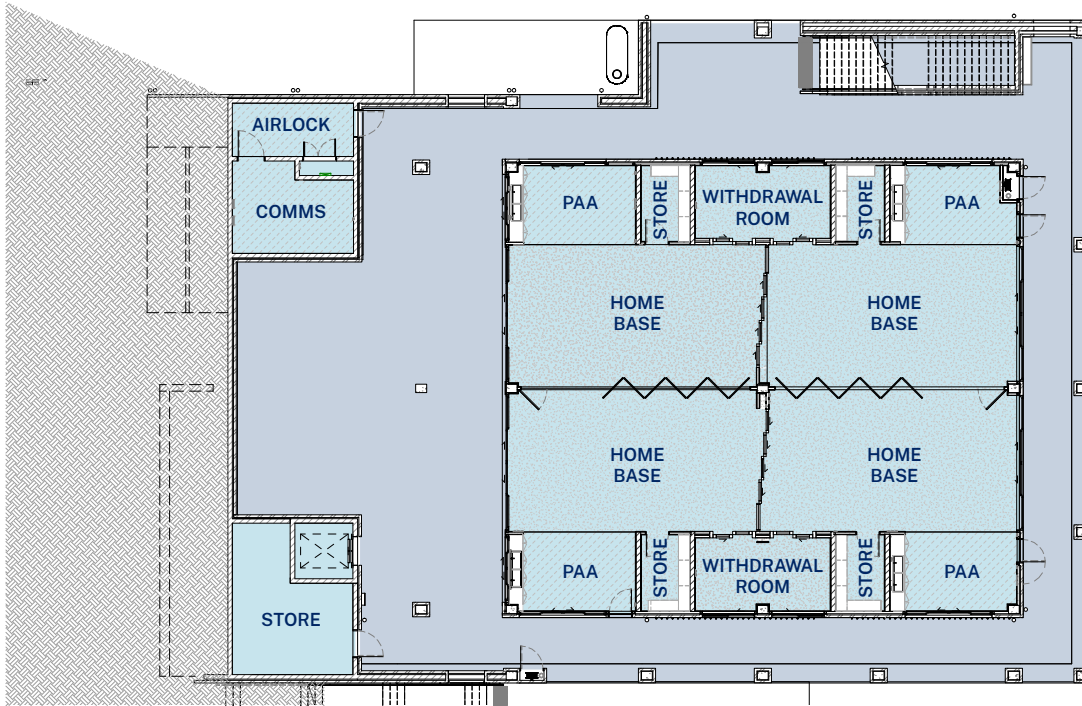

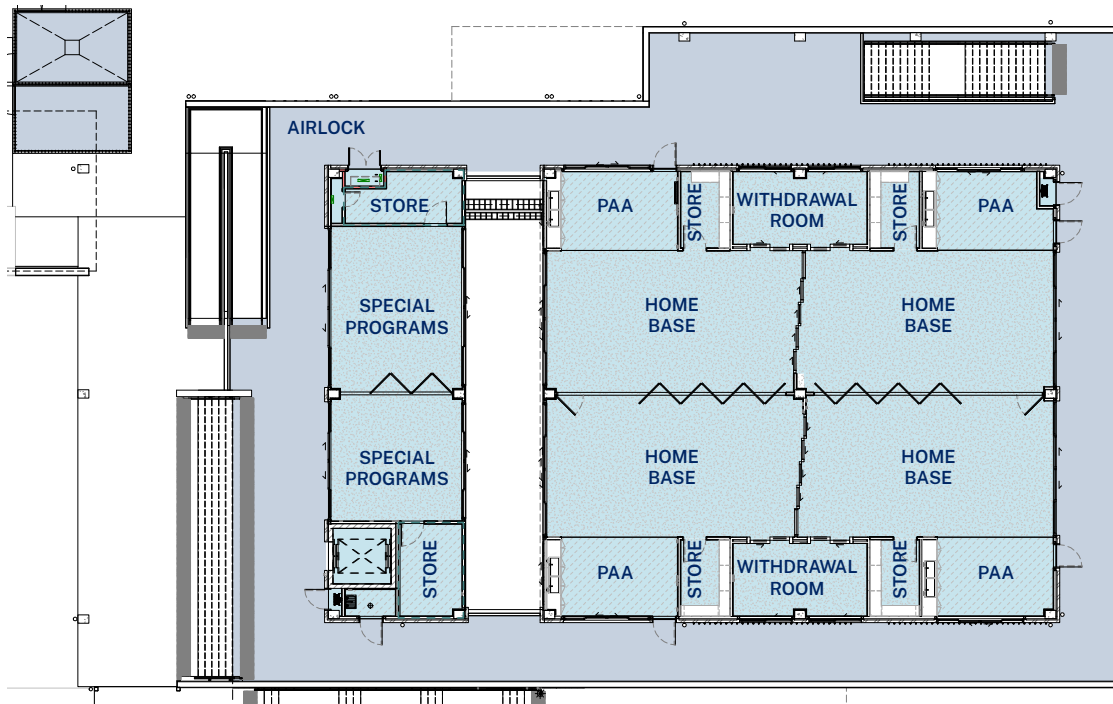


# New flexible classrooms – Building 3: Creek

## Ground floor

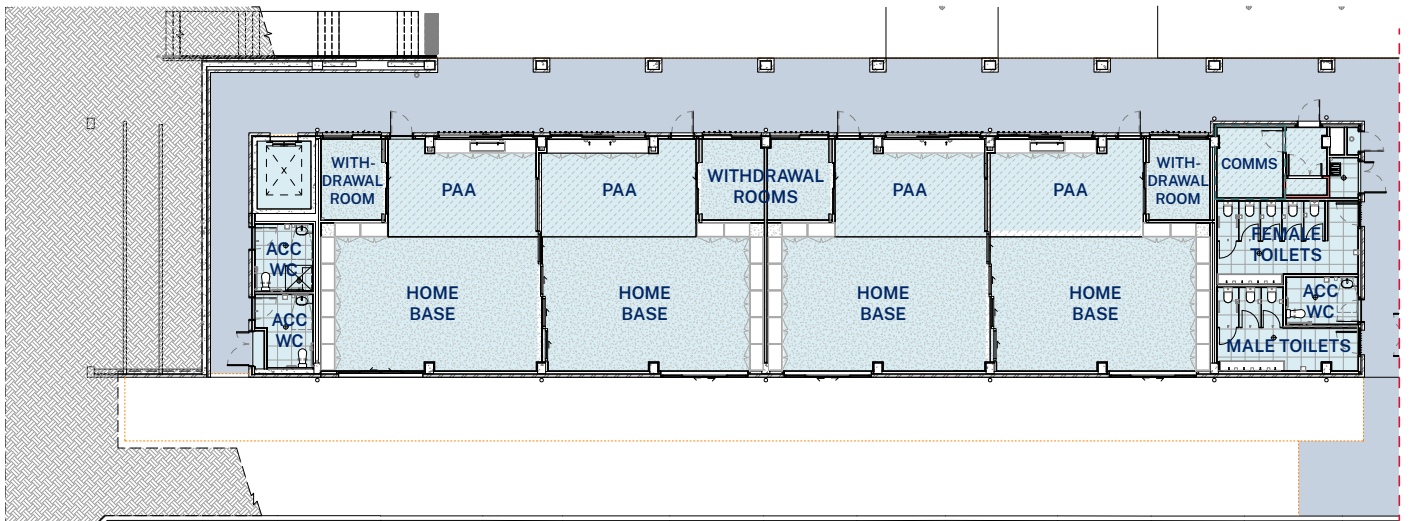


The new classroom buildings 3 (Creek) and 4 (Forest) at Kingscliff Public School include flexible classrooms that will allow teachers to move walls and bring classes together, or to teach in smaller groups. Plus it provides opportunities for inclusive learning zones, with break-out spaces that enable students to learn in new ways and with new technologies.

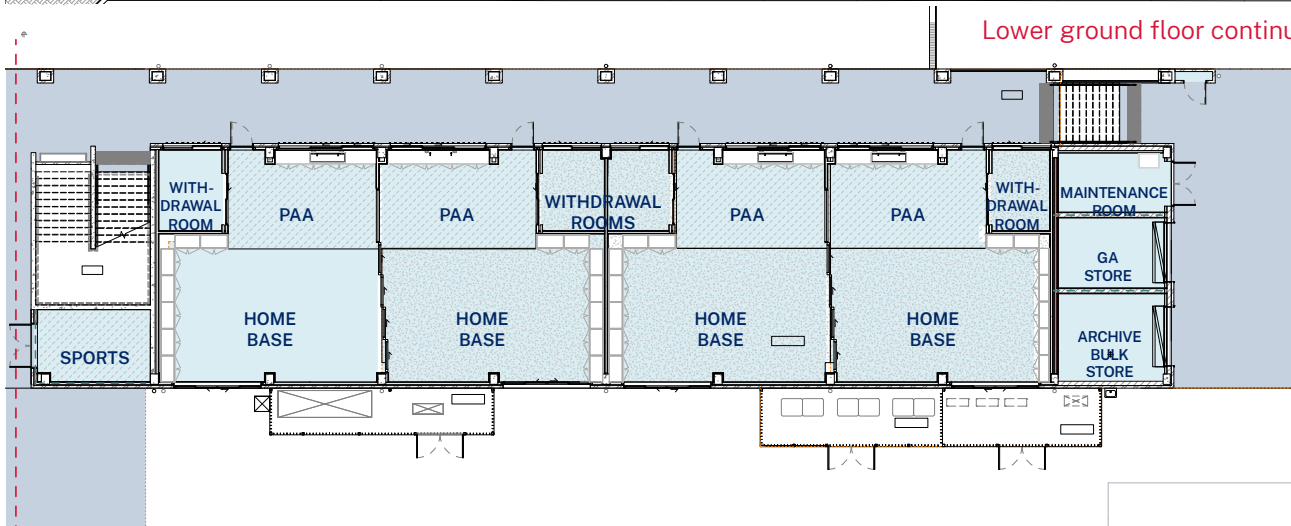
These new classrooms will facilitate Kingscliff Public School students to build skills in collaboration, communication, critical thinking, problem solving and creativity through our Contemporary Learning Modes. The classrooms are connected by covered walkways, with bag racks located outside classrooms for students.

# New flexible classrooms – Building 4: Forest

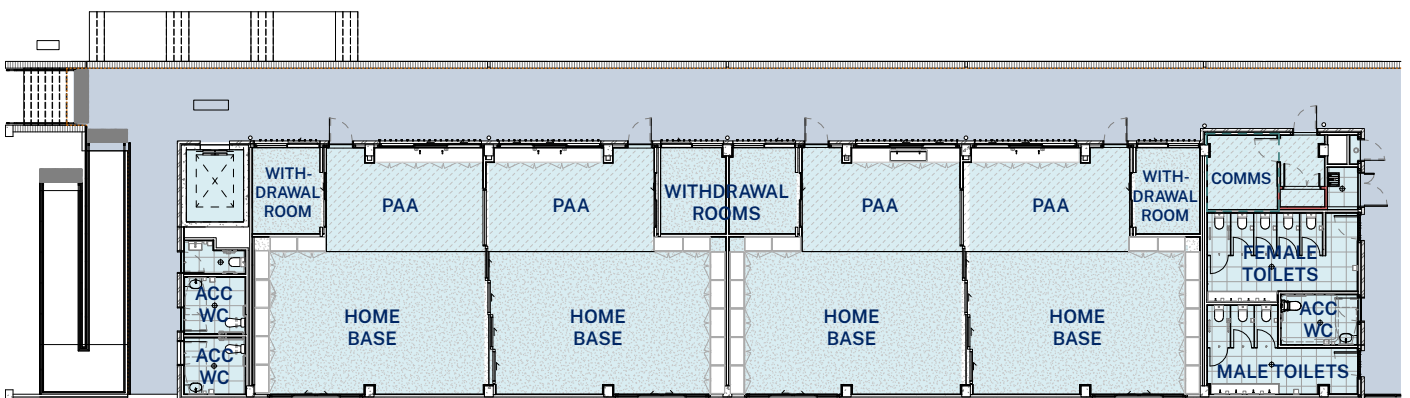

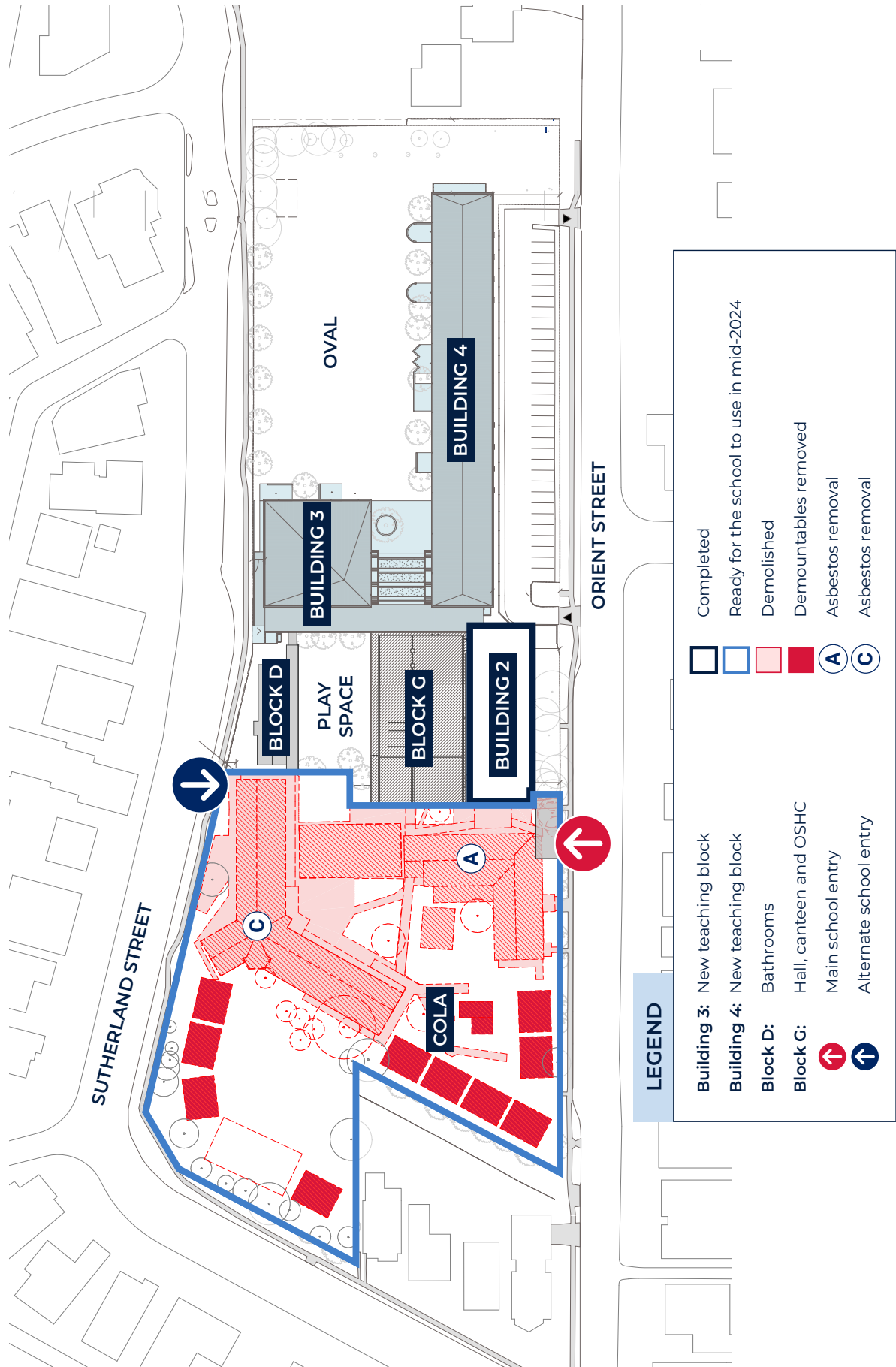
The covered area in the Creek Building allowing classrooms to flow outside

## Frequently asked questions

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### Which classes will be in which buildings?

Until the final classroom block is complete, Creek will house K-2 and Forest years 3-6.

On completion, K-2 will be in Beach, 5/6 in Creek and 3/4 in Forest.

### What work is next in the upgrade?

The older part of the school has been demolished to make way for the new Beach Building.

### When will the upgrade be completed?

We are still looking at a full completion date in mid-2024. However, getting access to buildings 3 and 4 is a huge milestone.

### Will the older part of the school be secured until that is completed?

Yes – there will be no access for students or staff until the final handover is complete.
