In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

Kingscliff Public School is being upgraded to provide new permanent teaching spaces and core facilities to cater for future enrolment growth in the area. The scope of work includes replacement of all classrooms including demountable buildings, a new library, an extended hall with new canteen, new play spaces and a redeveloped school entry.

Progress summary

Early works (Stage 1) to extend the existing school hall and provide a new student canteen started during the Term 1 school holidays.

A request for tenders (RFT) has been issued for the main construction works (Stage 2) and responses are due in August 2020.

Next steps

- Continue early works.
- Evaluate tender responses and appoint a main works building contractor.
