Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild public education, the 2024-25 Budget is delivering record education funding, including \$8.9 billion for new and upgraded schools. This targeted investment will ensure growing communities get access to a world class public education.

The NSW Government is planning an upgrade for Kogarah Public School to replace the demountable classroom facilities currently in use at the school, with a permanent building. The upgrade will include:



New modern classrooms



Dedicated support classrooms



New multipurpose hall



Outdoor spaces / play areas



Covered outdoor learning area



Lift accessibility

Construction will be coordinated to ensure the school remains operational and teaching and learning can continue onsite.




Temporary demountables and removal of old demountables


In preparation for the upgrade, 6 new temporary demountables and 2 amenities demountables have been installed in the existing staff carpark (see red shaded area). Lessons will start in the new demountable buildings in mid-Term 4, following the completion of the temporary classroom fit-out installations.



Proposed site concept plan

The demountables will be replaced with a new 2 storey building with modern classrooms, new amenities and a new multipurpose hall.





Proposed master plan

The preliminary master plan for the new facilities includes a 2 storey classroom building to replace the outdated demountable buildings.

The hall can accommodate approximately 300 chairs, with an attached covered outdoor learning area. This space is the largest size primary school hall delivered by the Department, and is big enough to accommodate whole-of-school assemblies, offering flexibility for both indoor and outdoor functions.

The master plan is subject to change. The community will be kept informed of the final project design as the project develops.




Next steps and upcoming works

In Term 4, after the removal of 11 demountables, works will include archaeological, geotechnical, and site investigations for existing services within the construction area for the new classroom building and hall. This will involve digging small trenches by hand and some light machinery excavation.

Strict measures will be in place to prevent unauthorised access to ensure the safety of students, staff and the community.

The master planning design is continuing in consultation with the Project Reference Group (PRG) to progress detailed planning and consideration of project staging options.



Managing construction impacts

We will work with the contractor to manage impacts on the local community, and in close consultation with the Kogarah Public School leadership to ensure that school operations continue with minimal disruption.
