The NSW Government is investing \$6 billion over the next four years to deliver more than 170 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$847 million is being spent on school maintenance over four years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Ku-ring-gai High School

A project is underway at Ku-ring-gai High School. The project will involve construction of a new multi-purpose hall and refurbishment of some of the school's teaching spaces.

Progress summary

The design is completed for the multi-purpose hall and the development application has also been lodged with the local council.

Site signage has been installed for the commencement of early works. The upgrade is expected to be completed mid 2020.

Summer school holiday works

Works will continue during the school holidays, including the removal of trees.

We are here to make sure that work is completed safely and efficiently. During this time we will be working collaboratively with the school community and neighbours to ensure that disruptions to the community are minimised.

Frequently asked questions

What works will be completed over the holidays?

During January 2019 works will include:

- tree removal in accordance with DA consent
- removal of materials from the site in trucks.

No works will take place on public holidays and Sundays.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Hoarding and shade cloth will be erected to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and our neighbours. Dust from demolition and construction works will be hosed down with water as required.

Traffic management will be in place where required to manage vehicles entering and exiting the site.
