Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6 billion over the next four years to deliver more than 170 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over four years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Ku-ring-gai High School

A major project is underway to upgrade Ku-ring-gai High School. This project will deliver a new multi-purpose hall that will replace the concrete dome and refurbishment of some of the school's existing teaching spaces.

Progress summary

The design is completed for the multi-purpose hall and enabling works including tree removal were completed earlier this year.

Earlier this month, three demountable units were installed to support the upgrade to the high school.

The contract for construction has been awarded to Stephen Edwards Constructions with the school upgrade expected to be completed in mid 2020, pending planning approvals.


Important: Changes to student access to the bus bays

From early June 2019, we will install hoarding around the site location for the new hall.

This means there will be some changes to the way students access the bus bays on Bobbin Head Road.

Students will need to walk around the hoarding and gather in front of the Tagore Building for bus travel.

Frequently asked questions

What are the next steps for the upgrade?

The contractor is preparing the work area so that construction can begin. The contractor will:

- erect construction hoarding and temporary fencing
- install the site office and work sheds
- deliver equipment and demountables
- set the concrete demountable footings.

What are the hours of work?

Work will take place from 7am to 5pm Monday to Friday, and 8am to 1pm, Saturdays. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays.

Is there an impact to current school operations?

No. School operations during Term 2 will continue as usual.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Hoarding and shade cloth will be erected to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and our neighbours.

How will traffic be managed?

The site will be separated from the school grounds by security fences and hoardings and contractors will enter the site via dedicated entryways as shown on the map above. Traffic management measures will be put in place to ensure access around school grounds is managed.

Construction vehicle movements and deliveries will be scheduled to minimise impacts to peak times.

How will you keep us informed?
