Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over the next four years to deliver 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Ku-ring-gai High School

A project is underway at Ku-ring-gai High School. The project will deliver 15 refurbished teaching spaces, three outdoor learning spaces to support future focussed learning and a new multipurpose hall to improve the operations and performance of the school.

Progress update

Construction is progressing well on the multipurpose hall with the installation of structural steel nearing completion. Three temporary demountables have been installed to cater for students and teachers while renovations are underway to refurbish learning spaces. These will be removed at the end of all construction works.

Summer works

Construction work will continue over the Term 4 holidays with activities focussed on the multipurpose hall, installation of the lift, the refurbishment of 15 learning spaces and the outdoor learning spaces to be completed.

Pedestrian access via the main gate off Bobbin Head Road will be temporarily closed while a rainwater tank will be installed during the Term 4 holidays.

We are here to make sure that work is completed safely and efficiently and we will minimise impacts on the community at every opportunity.

Summer works will take place on 27, 28 and 30 December 2019.

Frequently asked questions

What works will be completed over the holidays?

Construction work will continue over the Term 4 holidays with activities focussed on the multipurpose hall, installation of the lift, the refurbishment of 15 learning spaces and the outdoor learning spaces to be completed.

A rainwater tank will be installed near the main school entry during the Term 4 holidays.

What are the construction working hours?

The construction working hours for the summer break period are:

Monday to Friday, 7.00am to 5.00pm

Saturday, 7.00am to 1.00pm

No work is scheduled to take place on Sundays.

Will construction take place over Christmas and New Year?

No construction works will take place at Ku-ring-gai High School between 24 and 26 December 2019. The works will continue on 27, 28 and 30 December 2019.

What safety measures will be in place?

The health and safety of the community is our highest priority. Temporary fencing has been erected around the construction site to secure the area and prevent public access.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Noise and dust control measures will be implemented in accordance with planning approval requirements.

Hoarding and shade cloth have been erected to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and local residents. Dust from construction works will be hosed down as required in line with current water restrictions.

How will traffic be managed?

Traffic management will be in place where required for the safety of students, staff, the local community and workers.

Traffic controllers will be used where required to manage entry and exit of vehicles to and from the construction site. Vehicles will give way to pedestrians at all times.
