School holiday works

During the Term 4 2020 school vacation, construction will continue at Kyeemagh Public School after school breaks up on Wednesday 16December 2020.

The site will be closed from 24 December until 3 January 2021.

Works will resume on Monday 4 January and continue through the January school holidays.

Construction work hours are in accordance with the State Significant Development (SSD) consent conditions:

- Monday to Friday construction works will be from 7.00am to 6.00pm.
- Saturday construction works during the school holidays may go from 8.00am to 1.00pm.

There will be no work on Sundays or Public Holidays.

Frequently asked questions

Will street parking be impacted during construction?

There will be minimal impact to street parking. The impact of our project on the community is considered in our planning. We work with councils and the community to identify issues and put in place mitigation measures.

How will traffic be managed?

Traffic management will be in place where required for the safety of the students, staff, site visitors, local community and workers. Traffic controllers will be used to manage the entry and exit of vehicles to and from the construction site as necessary. Vehicles will give way to pedestrians at all times.

What steps are be taken to control noise and dust?

The contractor will implement dust and noise control measures. Dust and noise are minimised with hoarding, shade cloth and spraying water.

Will utility services be interrupted as part of construction?

School Infrastructure NSW (SINSW) coordinates upgrades or new supplies of utility services with local providers to minimise disruption. In the event that there will be any disruption to the local area, we will notify businesses and residents well in advance.

What will the standard construction hours be?

SINSW works with the local council and stakeholders to minimise the impact of construction works on the local community. This means we comply with the local council's standard working hours. Adherence to these guidelines is often a condition of development approval. Construction hours are proposed to be 7:00am to 6:00pm Monday to Friday and 8:00am to 1:00pm Saturdays. No work will be conducted on Sundays or public holidays, unless required during the COVID-19 pandemic.

What will be the construction hours during the COVID-19 pandemic be?

In line with the current NSW Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID-19 Development – Construction Work Days Order 2020), during the COVID-19 pandemic, SINSW construction sites can operate between 7:00am and 6:00pm on weekends and public holidays. This is to allow workers to abide by social distancing rules while on construction sites by distributing building work across the week.

The community will be kept informed of any changes to the standard working hours under this Order.

When will enrolments be accepted?

Will there be any changes to surrounding school enrolment boundaries?

If changes to school catchment boundaries / enrolment areas are needed, the Department of Education will work closely with the school and community to advise them and help them plan for any boundary realignments.
