Pacific Highway works

Works Update | 30 October 2023

Pacific Highway roadworks at Grosvenor Road

Lindfield Learning Village Stage 2 main works were finished in September 2021 and the new facilities are being enjoyed by the school.

As part of the project's traffic and transport strategy, we will be carrying out works to the Pacific Highway in the vicinity of Grosvenor Road to improve road access arrangements to Lindfield Learning Village.

Road works to start on the Pacific Highway at Grosvenor Road

Modifications to the Pacific Highway at Grosvenor Road will provide a longer right-hand turn bay which will be increased from an approximate length of 75m to 190m, allowing a greater area for right turning cars to queue and helping to avoid disruptions to the flow of traffic on the Pacific Highway. This will enhance safety at the intersection without undue disruption to residents or road users. See map of planned extension over page. The works will include:

- the removal of the nearside lane from the northbound side of the road and line repainting, noting that both sides of the road will retain two traffic lanes
- line repainting
- repositioning of the kerb/median diving opposing lanes of traffic
- resurfacing where the previous median island was located
- new traffic signage/relocation of existing traffic signage
- removal of bus indent lane (existing bus stop will remain in the same location).

Kerb and footpath works will take place from Sunday 12 November to Thursday 16 November.

Road works will start on Thursday 23 November and will take approximately 2 weeks.

These dates are weather dependent and are subject to change.

Tree removal

As previously notified, there are 3 trees outside Lindfield Public School and 234 Pacific Highway in the verge that overhang onto the Pacific Highway carriageway. The identified trees have been assessed by an arborist and recommended for approval, which has been approved by Ku-ring-gai Council.

A map of identified trees can be found over the page. The tree in the verge identified as a willow bottlebrush will not be removed and measures will be applied during works to protect this tree.

These works being planned for **Monday 6 November until Thursday 9 November between 8.30pm to 5am.**

Work activities include; removal of upper vegetation, and then removal of trunk by use of chainsaws and chippers. Stump grinders will be used once trunk levels are reduced to acceptable working heights. All vegetation trimming and tree removal work will be carried out by an approved arborist and trees will be replaced in line with guidance from Ku-ring-gai Council. The replanting of trees is planned for next Autumn.

We will ensure traffic controllers will be on site to safely direct pedestrians and vehicles around the works.



Nightworks

In order to minimise disruption to traffic and the community, works will take place at night:

- **8:30pm to 5am Sunday to Thursday**

High noise activities such as jackhammering and concrete saw cutting will cease by midnight on all working nights.

We will not work on Friday or Saturday night, public holidays or during heavy rainfall. We apologise for the inconvenience and will apply measures to minimise the impact of noise on nearby businesses and residents.

Traffic management and changes

The works will be staged to minimise impacts to the road network during construction. The staging will involve closure of one northbound lane and two southbound lanes during the night works.

Traffic controllers will be responsible for managing both pedestrian and cyclist movements around the site. Clear signage will be displayed on Pacific Highway to notify pedestrians and cyclists travelling near the site of any potential changes to their route and alternative paths to be taken.

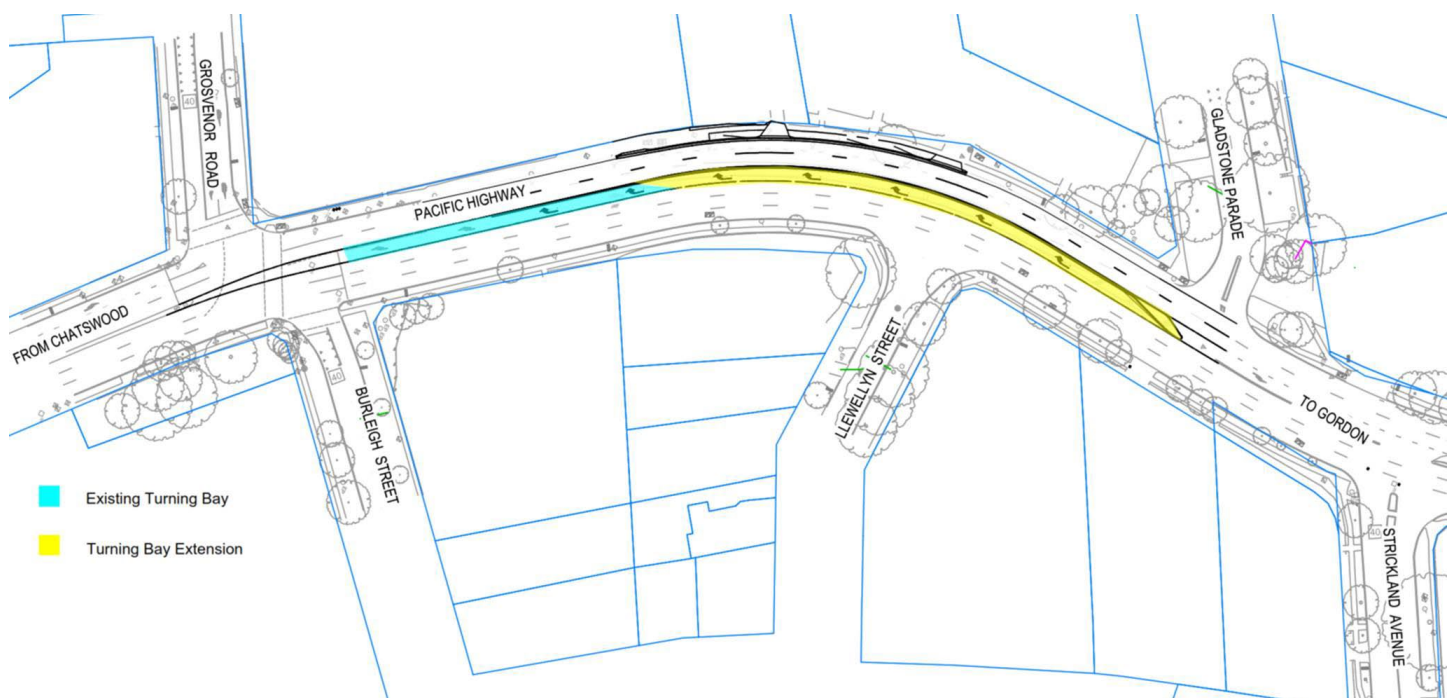
