Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver more than 200 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

School Infrastructure NSW is currently delivering Stage 2 of Lindfield Learning Village. This stage will provide additional specialist and technical learning spaces, as well as a senior home base focusing on specialised expertise and wellbeing support to transition students between school and their first post-school destinations.

Key features of Stage 2 include:

- refurbishment of the existing buildings
- internal fit out works, delivered in phases
- new kiss and drop and bus access
- new covered outdoor learning area (COLA) and additional play space
- repurposing of the existing lecture theatres into new drama and music teaching theatres

Stage 2 is expected to be completed by Day 1 Term 1 2022.

Progress summary

This first phase of Stage 2 was completed for Day 1 Term 1 2021. This phase provided new facilities to accommodate an additional 380 students. These facilities included:

- Music and visual arts classrooms
- Science labs
- A new school administration wing
- Additional interactive learning spaces and workshops

We are now in the second phase of Stage 2 and will be continuing to build additional amenities to accommodate more students for Day 1 Term 1 2022.

Upcoming works

As the project progresses, we want to keep the community informed about what's happening onsite. Scheduled asbestos removal between 22 February and 15 March 2021 has been completed.

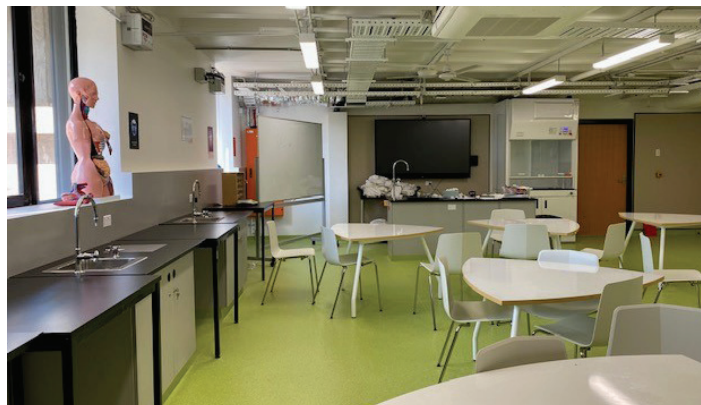
Over the next couple of months, the team will be working to finalise:

- the extension to the driveway from Eton Road to the southern part of the area, for emergency vehicles and the drop off and pick up zone
- an extended bus turnaround structure south of the upper carpark to allow buses to enter and turn around safely within the school site
- repurposing of the existing lecture theatres into new drama and music teaching theatres.

Further to this, Kur-ring-gai Council will continue to complete footpath work along Eton and Abingdon roads.

Lindfield Learning Village Stage 2 Community Consultative Committee (CCC)

As part of Stage 2 works, we recently held our first Lindfield Learning Village Community Consultative Committee (CCC) on 25 February 2021. The meeting was held at the school and was attended by five community representatives, three representatives from SINSW and the Department of Education, and was chaired independently.

Minutes from the meeting will be published on the project website prior to the next meeting on 29 April 2021.

What is a Community Consultative Committee?

This CCC is required by the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment on this State Significant Development project. CCC's are set-up to ensure the community and key stakeholders are:

- kept informed on the status of the projects, any new initiatives and the performance of contractors
- consulted on the development of projects, management plans and proposed changes to approved projects
- able to provide feedback on key issues that may arise during the development or implementation of projects.

Construction hours

As of 25 March 2021, working hours will return to standard construction hours following the end of the COVID-19 Development Construction Order (2020). These construction hours will be:

- 7:00am to 6:00pm, Monday to Friday
- 8:00am to 1:00pm, Saturdays
- No work will be conducted on Sundays or public holidays.

From time-to-time, work hours may need to be extended, provided noise levels do not exceed the existing background noise level plus 5 decibels. These extended work hours are:

- 6:00pm to 7:00pm, Monday to Friday
- 1:00pm to 4:00pm, Saturdays

Further to this, work will continue as usual during the Easter school holiday period from Tuesday 6 April to Friday 16 April 2021.

All work carried out on Lindfield Learning Village is in line with the State Significant Development conditions of consent, as determined by the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment.
