Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6 billion over the next four years to deliver more than 170 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$847 million is being spent on school maintenance over four years, along with a record \$500 million for the sustainable Cooler Classrooms program to provide air conditioning to schools. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Lindfield Learning Village

A project is underway to refurbish the former University of Technology Sydney (UTS) Ku-Ring-Gai site into a new school.

The project includes:

- Three new homebase schools within the building
- Upgrading the existing theatre
- Upgrading the existing sports hall
- High-quality technical spaces for science, engineering, hospitality, visual and performing arts, as well as music and film.

Project summary

Since receiving development consent, works have included a clean of the building exterior, installation of new services and lifts and completing a makeover of the existing auditorium. External car parks, including service roads, have also been improved including recommissioning of the existing fire trail.

In addition, waterproofing, testing of the site and underground water and thinning of the vegetation to comply with bush fire regulations has also occurred.

Next steps

In the coming weeks, the internal areas will be fitted out with new wall and floor finishes, joinery and equipment.

In January, the school will undergo final testing and commissioning and the landscaping and fencing works will be installed. In consultation with Council, the project team will clean and refresh the existing bus bay on Eton Road prior to completion.
